Made by young Paul and Line Maury from vineyards beside the Med. near Narbonne. Unoaked, this Chardonnay shows peach, apricot and citrus fruit flavours. Ripe and textured but also fresh and crisp on the finish, it would not be out of place in a flight of Mâcons.

Made by the brilliant, entrepreneurial Jérémie Huchet who saw there was a gap in the market for a light wine made from blending halves of two grapes in plentiful supply in the Loire – the Melon of Muscadet and Sauvignon Blanc. This has an open, grassy SB aroma, and then delivers a zippy, lightly exotically fruited mouthful with plenty of drive and freshness. Ideal warm-weather quaffing. *Now-2021*

From organically farmed vines, this is a long-established best-seller here, admired for its overt fruitiness, which is particularly pronounced in the hot 2019 vintage. Exotic fruit aromas of lemon peel tinged with mango. Bold citrus flavours with tropical fruit hints. With understated acidity and nicely rounded, this makes a relaxing aperitif but is equally at home with seafood. *Now-2021*

We rightly predicted we would sell a lot of this if we got a decent summer - we are on to our fifth pallet by mid June! It's a true, very pale Provence rosé bottled under screwcap at a reasonable price, coming from the vineyards of Château Ferry Lacombe (see below), supplemented by grapes sourced from neighbours. A blend of 80% Grenache and 20% Caladoc (a 20th century cross of Grenache and Malbec), this is fragrant, silky, light and fresh, and offers subtle red fruit. Now-2021

A discovery this spring: a lovely Côtes de Provence rosé at a fair price. Young Florent Crocé-Spinelli runs this fourth generation family-owned estate of 20 hectares just south-west of Draguignan. The vineyards are in their first year of conversion to organic viticulture. From 60% Grenache, 35% Cinsault and 5% Syrah, this has a lovely scent of peach blossom, and a silky palate of raspberry and white peach. Sophisticated and oh so drinkable.

Naos is a Greek temple or shrine. The Pinot family who run this Château. like Greek names for their wines. perhaps because their vineyards lie in the foothills of Mont Olympe (819m.) and the Monts Auréliens. This is

one of their best, from 60% Grenache and 40% Syrah grown on argilo-calcaire soils. Very pale. Enticing, lifted strawberry perfume. Appealing velvety concentration, delicate berried flavours lifted by a seductive hint of white peach, enlivened by a frisson of minerality. So refined. Now-2021

Bandol, a small appellation on the coast east of Marseilles and west of Toulon, produces the finest rosés in the world, based on the Mourvèdre grape which thrives on the sunshine and clay soils. It's a historic wine - the Count of Monte Cristo in Alexandre Dumas' great revenge novel of 1844 liked his glass of Bandol rosé "bien frais"! This is the seventh vintage we have shipped of this example made by Laurence Desblaches, the first female winemaker in Bandol, and her son Nicolas. Overt aroma of fresh peaches (and sea air?) leap out of the glass; and then there's an excitingly intense gamut of fruit flavours, from pink grapefruit and lemon peel to raspberries and red cherries. Really well-textured, with

a characteristic long, mineral and saline finish which tempts one to sip again.

"Pale to mid orangey salmon pink. Big and bold - a rosé to drink with food, preferably a strongly garlicky aïoli. It's not Tempier but it's pretty good and very much deeper and longer than any Côte de Provence rosé. A wine for serious food enjoyed in warm weather, with impressive persistence. I could imagine this going beautifully with roast beef and salad. For anyone who has visited this blessed corner of France in summer, it will create magical memories, 16.5/20".

THE UNOAKED CLARETS OF FRÉDÉRIC BORDERIE

When one recalls visits to Bordeaux Châteaux one visualises receding, vaulted cellars, full of oak barrels: the ageing of red Bordeaux in French oak barrels is a given. But Frédéric Borderie doesn't put these three wines in barrel at all. Interestingly, one is hardly aware of this when drinking them: Fred explains that with long maceration (i.e. soaking of the juice with the skins and pips) "some tannins from the ripe seeds give light toasted flavours". But dominant is unadorned, high quality, ripe fruit from a pair of lovely sunny vintages, making these three perfect for summer drinking. Arguably one also gains better value - a new oak barrel adds over £1 a bottle to the production cost of a wine.

Fred now owns and runs three distinct vineyard areas with different labels: Gravières de la Brandille, from vineyards on gravel and clay terraces by the river Isle near St Medard de Guizières; Les Combes on the higher, limestonebased vineyards of Lussac-Saint-Emilion; and Vieille Dynastie, a parcel of six hectares of warm, clayey Lalande de Pomerol bought with this name in 2011. We understand there may not be much of a call for magnums at the moment, but we offer them anyway - the good times for sharing will come back...

Ad Altiora implies aiming higher... This is from 100% Nebbiolo grown in the calcareous Bris Montersino vineyard. Lively black fruit with a tarry hint on the nose. Opens up to display abundant strawberry flavours: this is a big, warming wine with plenty of grip for keeping. "Mid ruby with orange tinges. Pretty nose of cherry with hints of orange skin and iron. Succulent fruit with a firm tannic core that needs more time. Quite powerfully structured but matched by plenty of fruit. 17/20", Walter Speller, jancisrobinson.com, 29th May 2019.

From the Gabutti vineyard below the cellar, a one hectare, south-east facing site on calcareous marl at about 330m of altitude. From 100% Nebbiolo, this is part aged in traditional large Slavonian oak vats, with a proportion in smaller French oak barrels. Very open, with that distinctive Nebbiolo perfume of cooked strawberries, cough medicine and tar. Very concentrated and fat, unfolding a compôte of autumnal red and black fruit spiked with cinnamon and that tarry hint again. Silky tannins give correct underlying structure. Exotic.

"Deep ruby. Intense and sweet dark-fruit nose. Concentrated and finely structured with elevated acidity and a big build-up of proper muscular tannins on the finish. Long and accessible, except for the tannins. 17.5/20", Walter Speller, jancisrobinson.com, 25th June 2019. "The nose is vivid, with redcurrant and raspberry aromas. Gianna de Neri's Brunello comes from two organically farmed plots on the gentle slopes near Torrenieri, north-east of Montalcino and just above the new winery built into the hillside. Soils are sandstone and clay, with some of the alberese, the limestone-rich land which Sangiovese loves. It's always authentic Brunello in its power and structure.
