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The Stone, Vine & Sun Producer Guide

These symbols represent our way of giving you some pointers as to the character, background and philosophy of the men and women who make the wines you buy.

YD Young Dudes

The younger generation who have taken over and are striving to be the best. They have often worked overseas, and have brought new energy and ideas back home.

OP Old Pros

A big category and a wide range of types: some are humble, content to turn out an excellent product at a reasonable price; others have quietly worked their way to the summit, and their wine may be correspondingly expensive. What they share is experience.

G Greens

Some of these growers have adopted bio-dynamic practice (ultra-organic, with attention to scheduling work in vineyard and cellar by phases of the moon), and most organic: many are certified, some not (as they can't face the paperwork and cost). All work harder in the vineyard to bring in healthy fruit, and wine-making may be as natural as possible.

Women of Wine

The female touch: which might be as owners, managers or winemakers. No stereotyping here - some turn out powerful wines!

SE Searchers / Experimenters

Obsessive growers and winemakers who push the boundaries: they may want to harvest at lower yields, pick later than anyone else, and experiment with different wine-making techniques. Sometimes this goes along with unusual behaviour: shy introverts or wildly exciting extroverts, we are fortunate to be able to spend time in their remarkable company.

DG Demi-Gods

A short list: owners of top vineyards with a rare genius for making great wine consistently.

★ A gold star denotes wines which we believe really represent our ethos: expressive of the land and usually excellent value, these range from highly popular stalwarts of the list to esoteric sidelines.

5 litre bag in box £43.50 (equivalent to £6.53 a bottle) Code BIB618 The Petit Pont wines are made by the Vic family near Beziers. The white is a *tutti frutti* blend of Vermentino with Chardonnay and spiced by other varieties. Fresh, easy-drinking mouthful showing stone fruit and melon with zesty acidity. Now-2020

YD La Combe Saint-Paul, Chardonnay, IGP Pays d'Oc, 2018, 13% Bottle £9.25 Case £105.45 Code CSP118

Unoaked, this Chardonnay shows peach, apricot and citrus fruit flavours. Ripe and textured but also fresh and crisp on the finish, it would not be out of place in a flight of Mâcons. Now-2020

★ 1 La Combe Saint-Paul, Vermentino, IGP Pays d'Oc, 2018, 13% Bottle £9.50 Case with £108.30 Code CSP218

Now one of our best sellers. Open, stone fruited attack gives way to a more gentle, pine-scented, well-textured mid-palate. Fruity but finishes dry - a fine all-rounder. Now-2020

YD La Combe Saint-Paul, Viognier, IGP Pays d'Oc, 2018, 13% Bottle £9.50 Case £108.30 Code CSP318

Such a pretty aroma of blossom - this is on the light, fresh, floral side of Viognier - white peach and orange blossom. True Viognier body, and a good dry finish. Now-2020

DP La Grave, Minervois Blanc, Expression, 2018, 13% Bottle £10.95 Case £124.83 Code GRV618

80% old vine Macabeu with Vermentino and Marsanne. Textured and quite concentrated, with apple and melon flavours and a hint of white pepper, but also displaying a nutty / mealy note. Now-2020

★ W Creyssels, Picpoul de Pinet, Languedoc, 2018, 13.5% Bottle £11.25 Case £128.25 Code CRE118

Julie Benau makes a top Picpoul - this is the 15th vintage in a row we have shipped! Very open, citrus and pine scents. A touch more texture than usual, fresh and limey, with the merest saline note on the long finish. Now-2020

D La Combe Saint-Paul, Languedoc, Calcaires d'Ensérune, 2017, 12.5%

Bottle £11.25 Case £128.25 Code CSP417

From halves of Roussanne and Vermentino (Rolle), grown on limestone soils, and about 10% aged in old barrels, this combines weight and freshness. Attractive white peach character with an accent of marzipan and a dry, chalky character too. Rosemary George, *My Top 30:* Languedoc Whites, **Decanter**, August 2018. Now-2020

YD G Grand Arc, Corbières Blanc, Veillée d'Equinoxe, 2018, 14% Bottle £11.25 Case £128.25 Code DGA618

An unoaked blend of 40% Grenache Blanc, 25% each of Roussanne and Vermentino, plus 10% Macabeu. Stone fruited aromas follow onto the palate, rich and well-rounded with notes of white pepper and an attractive honeyed accent. Now-2020 *Limited stock*

G Météore, Faugères Blanc, Les Aquarides, 2017, 14% Bottle £13.95 Case £159.03 Code MET717

50% Roussanne with 40% Rolle (Vermentino) and 10% Clairette: a scent of exotic fruit anticipates a wonderful cocktail of flavours; stone fruit and pineapple. Concentrated, fresh and complete. The excellent 2018, renamed Léonides, follows. Now-2020

Fontanel, Côtes du Roussillon Blanc, 2016, 14% Bottle £14.95 Case £170.43 Code FON716

From ancient (1908) complanted vines of Grenache Blanc and Gris plus Roussanne and Malvoisie, with subtly integrated oak, this is a powerful white, offering a generous mouthful of white peach and tangerine, almond, honey, orange blossom and fennel. Creamy, fat and altogether satisfying. Now-2020

G Begude, Chardonnay, Limoux, L'Etoile, 2017, 13.5% Bottle £16.95 Case £193.23 Code BEG217

A star barrel-fermented Chardonnay from vineyards in the foothills of the Pyrenees: "Crisp but with lots of personality and great balance. Not burgundy but definitely French...Cood stuff. GV. 16.5/20", Jancis Robinson, jancisrobinson.com, 18 October 2018. Now-2022

Rosé

DP Petit Pont, Rosé, IGP Pays d'Oc, 2018, 12.5% SC Bottle £8.25 Case £94.05 Code PEP518

Grenache and Cinsault, grown near Beziers in the Languedoc, but crafted in the Provençale style, pale coloured, a light, dry and refreshing glass of strawberry and cranberry fruit, perfect for regular consumption. Now-2020

DE La Grave, Minervois Rosé, Expression, 2018, 13% Bottle £10.50 Case £119.70 Code GRV418

From approximate halves of Syrah and Grenache, this unfailingly delivers splendid ripeness and intensity. Pale pink. Lifted red fruit aromas. An appealing and hugely generous gush of strawberries and raspberries. This is a perfect all rounder, fruity enough to enjoy on its own but also dry enough for food. Now-2020

Les Quatre Tours, Coteaux d'Aix en Provence Rosé, Signature, 2018, $13\,\%$

Magnum £26.50 Case (6 x 150cl.) £151.05 Code QUA918

The characteristic Provençale blend of 50% Grenache, 30% Syrah plus Cabernet Sauvignon and Rolle from a small co-operative just north of Aix. Very pale - a transparent onion skin tint - generous fruit and restrained elegance: flavours of white peach, melon and berries, with satisfying weight and a fine dry finish. Now-2020

★ W Ribotte, Bandol Rosé, Cuvée Anaïs, 2018, 13% Pottle 517 95 Case 5204 62 Code PIPE18

Bottle £17.95 Case £204.63 Code RIB518

Bandol produces the finest rosés in the world, based on the Mourvèdre grape which thrives on the Mediterranean sunshine and clay soils: exciting aromas of white peach and pink grapefruit leap out of the glass; followed by delectable intensity of peach melba and cream. Really well-textured, with a characteristic long and mineral finish. Now-2021

Red - IGP wines

Les Pradelles, IGP d'Hérault, 2018, 12% SC

Red fruited with a surprisingly good texture, no rough edges, soft, light and juicily berried. Perfect for parties! Now-2020

DP Petit Pont, Rouge, IGP Pays d'Oc, 2017, 12.5% SC Bottle £8.25 Case £94.05 Code PEP617

5 litre bag in box £43.50 (equivalent to £6.53 a bottle) Code BIB218 Largely from Grenache, Cinsault and a little Cabernet Sauvignon. Bramble fruited but with a lighter, raspberry accent and minimal tannin: a fruity, easy-drinking style. Now-2020

OP Comtesse de Marion, Merlot, IGP Pays d'Oc, 2017, 13% SC Bottle £9.25 Case £105.45 Code VIC317

Now in a taller bottle and a smarter label, this shows attractive typicity: aromas of sweet plum with a leafy touch, followed by a supple and lightly creamy, berried palate with barely discernible tannins. The 2018 follows. Now-2020

La Croisade, Pinot Noir, IGP Pays d'Oc, 2018, 13% SC Bottle £9.50 Case £108.30 Code AGW718

With fruit in part sourced from cool Limoux, crisp and classy, blended with riper grapes from the plains, this is a friendly, supple Pinot showing fresh cherries with a touch of vanilla. Now-2020

W Les Hauts de Median, Petit Verdot, IGP Pays d'Oc,

2018, 13.5% SC

Bottle £9.95 Case £113.43 Code VIC218

Deeply hued, impressive example crafted by Aurélie Trébuchon: classy layers of red and black fruits, subtle tannins, and vivacious acid. Now-2022

YD Fontanel, IGP Côtes Catalanes, 2017, 14%

Bottle £11.50 Case £131.10 Code FON417

From young vines of Grenache, Mourvèdre and Carignan grown in hot, dry and windy mountain vineyards near Tautavel. Gorgeously juicy and vital wine, showing vibrant strawberry fruit, spiced with white pepper and liquorice. Now-2020

G W SE Mas des Brousses, Chasseur des Brousses, IGP Pays d'Oc, 2016, 13.5%

Bottle £12.95 Case £147.63 Code MAB116

From about 50% Merlot, 30% Grenache with some Syrah; and a surprisingly successful marriage of Bordeaux and the Rhône. Generous mouthful of brambly fruit, supple and refined, with hints of menthol and liquorice, and subtle tannins. Very aromatic and long. The 2017 follows. Now-2021

G Begude, Pinot Noir, IGP Haute Vallée de l'Aude, 2018, 13.5% Bottle £12.95 Case £147.63 Code BEG618

A long term favourite here, a fresh and pure Pinot - just 10% goes into old barrels. Fresh palate with strawberry, raspberry and cherry flavours. Juicy and ripe with a crisp, long finish. Now-2021

Mas d'Agamas, Carignan Bleu, IGP Saint-Guilhem-le-Désert, 2017, 13.5%

Bottle £14.50 Case £165.30 Code AGA117

Carignan Bleu - a variant of Carignan - is named because of the bluish tint the grapes take on when fully ripe. It makes for a gorgeous purple colour, and a very un-rustic, soft, well-textured, fleshy mouthful of black plums and spice. Now-2021

G Météore, Carignides, Vin de France, 2017, 13.5% Bottle £17.50 Case £199.50 Code MET317

From a single plot of 55 year old vines : vibrant purple, flamboyantly flavoured with raspberry jelly and dark chocolate, well-textured, this shows how polished and exciting Carignan from old vines can be. Now-2022 *Arriving in October*

Red - Appellation wines

DP La Grave, Minervois Rouge, Tristan et Julien, 2017, 13% Bottle £10.50 Case £119.70 Code GRV117

From halves of Grenache and Syrah, showing the strawberry sweetness of the former combined with the briary black fruit of the latter; an uncomplicated, hugely pleasing country wine. Now-2021

G YD Grand Arc, Corbières Rouge, Reserve Grand Arc, 2016, 14.5% Bottle £11.50 Case £131.10 Code DGA216

One of our staples at SVS, about 50% Carignan, with 35% Grenache and 15% Mourvedre, a splendid barrel-aged wine which can be drunk young or kept. Dark and intense, this delivers a big mouthful of red fruit backed by masses of ripe tannins. Now-2022

★ 1 La Combe Saint-Paul, La Clape, Grés Rouges, 2017, 14% Bottle £12.50 Case £142.50 Code CSP617

60% Syrah with 20% each of Mourvèdre and Grenache, basically unoaked (10% in old barrels). Youthful, deliciously ripe - black fruit and herbs, so Mediterranean, with a nice savoury note and gentle tannins. A well-priced, smartly presented bottle from this prestigious appellation. Now- 2022

G YD Grand Arc, Corbières, Cuvée de Quarante, 2016, 14.5% Bottle £12.95 Case £147.63 Code DGA316

Based on 45% Carignan with 35% Grenache and 20% Syrah, all in barrel, about 20% new: a blend at the Schenk cellar first made by Bruno when he was forty years old - hence the name. Dark fruited nose with accents of chocolate, dense texture and masses of red fruit on a smooth and silky frame. Bold and fruity. Nov-2023

G Météore, Faugères Rouge, Les Léonides, 2016, 13.5% Bottle £13.25 Case £151.05 Code MET116

Grenache, Syrah and Carignan, unoaked. This always exhibits a lovely lifted perfume and character derived from the schist soils. Lively and refreshing, with blackberry and blackcurrant flavours and a long finish. Now-2021 *Arriving in October*

D Fontanel, Côtes du Roussillon Rouge, 2016, 14% Bottle £13.50 Case £153.90 Code FON115

From Syrah, Grenache and Carignan grown on schist near Maury, unoaked, and a classic Roussillon red, with typical notes of pepper, tar and black olives tinging a juicy, brambly and strawberry accented heart. Now-2021

Mas d'Amile, Terrasses du Larzac, Le Petitou, 2016, 13% Bottle £13.95 Case £159.03 Code MDA216

From about 50% Grenache plus Syrah and Carignan, a fresh and rounded red, full of cool black fruit and a savoury hint. With moderate alcohol, supple and balanced, it's a crowd-pleaser. Now-2021

★ 10 Mas d'Agamas, Terrasses du Larzac, Nostre Mescladis, 2016, 14% Bottle £14.95 Case £170.43 Code AGA317

Nostre Mescladis translates as "our blend", reflecting the approximate proportions of vines across the family vineyards: about 40% Grenache, and 20% of each of Syrah, Mourvèdre and Carignan, all given a long maceration to develop great depth of flavour but vinified and bottled entirely unoaked. Supple and melting approach, with delicious flavours of heated strawberries. Juicy but also perfectly poised and refined. Now-2021

W Mas d'Amile, Languedoc-Montpeyroux, 2016, 13%

Bottle £17.95 Case £204.63 Code MDA316

Old vines, 60% Grenache with Carignan, Syrah and Mourvèdre, raised in a mix of old oak. Cherry and brambly notes, super ripe fruit with a hint of liquorice. Such a silky texture with a refreshing acidity. Supple and very long; fine wine. Now-2022

YD Fontanel, Côtes du Roussillon Villages Tautavel, Cistes, 2016, 14.5%

Bottle £18.25 Case £208.05 Code FON216

Named after the Cistus, the spring-flowering rock rose. 60% Syrah, welloaked, with 40% Grenache in tank. Smart, classy oak scents; gorgeous black fruit, rich, fat and spicy. Lots of texture but velvet smooth, an iron hand in a velvet glove. Now-2022

G W SE Mas des Brousses, Terrasses du Larzac, France, 2016, 14% Bottle £19.95 Case £227.43 Code MAB216

Largely Mourvèdre (grown from cuttings from the famed Domaine Tempier in Bandol), with Syrah and Grenache, barrel-aged. This came top among 58 wines of a December 2018 **Decanter** Languedoc blind tasting: "Complex and finely-etched, with a minty dark fruit aroma ceding to a firm and layered yet rounded and refined palate. A wine that's full of resonance, and with ageing potential. 94/100.". Now-2026

D La Combe Saint Paul, L'Insoupçonné, Languedoc-La Clape, 2015, 14.5%

Bottle £19.95 Case £227.43 Code CSP715

85% Syrah with Mourvèdre, given 10 months ageing in a mix of new and 2nd fill barrels - and a very limited production wine. Polished black fruit with fine grained tannins. Splendid concentration and perfume. La Clape red at its best. Now-2024

D Fontanel, Prieuré, Côtes du Roussillon Villages Tautavel, 2014, 14.5%

Bottle £20.50 Case £233.70 Code FON314

From one parcel on a high, windswept, north facing argilo-calcaire slope, this blend of 2/3 Syrah, with Grenache, and a little Mourvèdre is given 18 months in new oak casks. Dramatic wine, revealing layers of black fruit, spice and mocha flavours; and ageing like a top northern Rhône, becoming more complex, meaty and savoury. Now-2022

SE Depeyre, Côtes du Roussillon Villages, Rubia Tinctoria, 2014, 14.5%

Bottle £21.50 Case £245.10 Code DEP414

From 90% Syrah plus 10% Grenache, a great unoaked red, offering amazingly deep colour, cassis-like perfume and a striking heart of bittersweet blackcurrants and liquorice with mineral depths. Energetic, velvety wine. Now-2023 *Limited stock*

W Ribotte, Bandol, 2014, 13.5%

Bottle £22.50 Case £256.50 Code RIB814

Bandol, based largely on Mourvèdre, is usually backward, but this is already expressive, showing a nose of Asian spice on black fruit; with impressive, inky concentration, well-covered tannin and attractive savoury elements. A traditionally framed example. Now-2024

G Météore, St. Chinian, Parangon, 2015, 14%

Bottle £25.50 Case £290.70 Code MET215

From one eponymous high and cool plot of Syrah, with a little Grenache. Very deeply hued, delivering wonderful cassis flavours, a hint of black liquorice, an enticing, underlying meatiness - velvety, and all supported by very refined tannins. Great wine by any standards. Now-2025 Arriving in October

Rhône

White

G SE Amadieu, Cairanne Blanc, Haut de Beauregard, 2017, 14% Bottle £20.95 Case £238.83 Code AMB617

Roussanne, Clairette, Grenache Blanc and Viognier barrel fermented and aged in a mix of vessels. Ripe yellow peaches and apricot, plus notes of honey, almond and vanilla. Very concentrated and impressive. Now-2021 *Arriving in October*

D Pichat, Viognier, Côtes de Verenay, IGP Collines Rhodaniennes, 2017, 13%

Bottle £21.50 Case £245.10 Code PID817

Superb, lightly oaked northern Rhône Viognier from the same schistous soils as Condrieu: creamy apricot and peach with a hint of vanilla and satisfying depth. Now-2020

YD Pichat, Condrieu, 2017, 13.5% Bottle £41.50 Case £473.10 Code PID617

Wonderfull Condrieu, 1/3 in new barrels, with the stone fruit and wonderfully rich texture balanced by bright minerality. Very long. Magnificent, inimitable wine. Now-2020

Southern Rhône - Red

Vignerons d'Estézargues, Côtes du Rhône, Cuvée des Galets, 2018, 14% Bottle £9.95 Case £113.43 Code ESZ118

Juicy, unfiltered blend of Grenache, Cinsault and Syrah: raspberryish mouthful, mildly spicy and very moreish. A long term favourite at SVS. Now-2021

★ G Vignerons d'Estézargues, Organic Côtes du Rhône, 2018, 14.5% Bottle £10.50 Case £119.70 Code ESZ218

More black-fruited than the above, with brambly juiciness and a little more stuffing. Now-2022

YD La Pigeade, Ventoux, Les Sables, 2016, 13.5% Bottle £10.95 Case £124.83 Code PIG616

From 40% Grenache, 40% Carignan and 20% Syrah grown on sandy soils, this exemplifies Ventoux: different to Côtes du Rhône in its freshness, grace and moderate alcohol. Brilliant this year, almost candied cherryripe, lightly spiced with nutmeg; lovely flesh and perfume. Now-2020

G SE Espiers, Côtes du Rhône, 2016, 14.5%

Bottle £12.95 Case £147.63 Code ESP116

70% Grenache, 20% Mourvèdre and 10% Syrah; hearty, black-fruited, savoury and very superior CdR from densely planted, low yielding vines around Vacqueyras and Gigondas. Now-2022

G W Joncier, l'O, Côtes du Rhône, 2017, 13.5%

Bottle £12.95 Case £147.63 Code JON217

L'O not for water but purity in this unoaked, organically and biodynamically farmed and hand-harvested Grenache from 45 year old vines. All raspberries and cherries, energetic, backed by soft tannins. Now-2020

G SE Amadieu, Côtes du Rhône Villages, 2018, 14% Bottle £13.50 Case £153.90 Code AMB118

70% Grenache and 30% Syrah, bio-dynamically farmed (and certified), all in tank, this is youthful, explosively vital, dense and fleshy. Exciting stuff. Now-2023 *Arriving in October*

YD La Pigeade, Beaumes-de-Venise, 2015, 14%

Bottle £13.95 Case £159.03 Code PIG715

From vines at 300m on the flanks of the Dentelles de Montmirail, 70% Grenache and 30% Syrah. Showing red and black fruit, quite fresh, and nicely smooth and ready. Good value. Now-2021

G W Joncier, Lirac, Le Gourmand, 2015, 14% Bottle £15.50 Case £176.60 Code JON515

Organic and Biodynamic. A mélange of blackberry, raspberry and cassis, very ripe and charming with a lovely texture. *Très gourmand* indeed! Now-2021

G SE Espiers, Côtes du Rhône Villages, Sablet, 2016, 15% Bottle £16.50 Case £188.10 Code ESP416


