A GUIDE TO THE BEAUTIFUL SOUTH: PROVENCE – LANGUEDOC – ROUSSILLON

Each year we delight in tasting and championing the wines from Provence, Languedoc and Roussillon. There is so much to love about the character and variety from this region. From bright and elegant fizz in Limoux to aromatic whites, the best rosés in the world, a plethora of characterful reds, and - let's not forget - Fontanel's superb Vin Doux Naturels (p15), there is something in this list for everyone.



We tasted widely from this region and were delighted by the superb overall quality of wine we found. Most of the wines we tasted were from the 2022 and 2023 vintages. Our producers were enthusiastic about both vintages. After the frost-affected 2021 these two years were much more straightforward with warm, long summers allowing for ripe and bountiful harvests. The purity and exuberance of the fruit really shines through in all of the wines. Highlights for both of us would be the whites, where the warmth has brought a richness and weight to the fruit: Liquière's Cistus Blanc (p.13) is a superb example of this. A note should also be made for the red blends based on Grenache. The long, warm growing seasons have allowed for a jewel and bright red fruit note to come to these wines: they are utterly charming.

We are delighted to introduce new wines to the list. Mention should be made for the new Fulcrand Cabanon wines from L'Estabel, the rosé (p.4), white (p.7) and red (p.8) all offering superb value and interest. Alongside these we have shipped a Maury Sec, "Arrels" from Domaine Fontanel (p.14), a fascinating and superb wine from an appellation normally associated with fortified wines.

Finally, we should note the value to be found in this list. Whilst prices have ticked up a little, care of the Chancellor's duty hike on wine last August, our suppliers have kept their prices flat for the most part. Viewed in the context of wine prices in general this is something that should be applauded and supported.

Enjoy hunting out the delights; or if you would rather take our recommendations, we have curated six different mixed cases which are spread out throughout this list.

History of the Region

Renowned as the oldest winemaking region in France, the South of France boasts a history and tradition as rich and complex as its wines. Beyond its viticultural heritage, the region is famous for stunning medieval towns like Carcassonne, a UNESCO World Heritage site, and towering Roman amphitheatres that stand as testaments to the region’s Roman influence. Its position on the periphery of France, has meant it has always had a reputation for free thinking and an independent streak – think of the Cathars. We believe both these themes permeate the winemakers of this region.

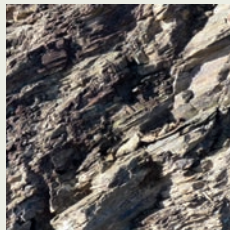


Climate

The area is France’s sunniest with over 300 days of sunshine a year. It enjoys a classic Mediterranean climate with mild winters, consistently dry summers, and moderate springs and autumns. There are microclimates throughout, which can heavily impact grapes and their resulting wines. The climate and strong winds (which keep pests and diseases at bay) contribute to the area’s ability to sustain a high level of organic viticulture.

Soils

Languedoc-Roussillon boasts a fascinating patchwork of soils, from alluvial soils near the coast to chalk, gravel and limestone further inland. Schist, a metamorphic rock formed of foliated sedimentary layers changed by heat and pressure, is found in a band across Faugères and Cabrières, but also in Corbières and Roussillon, notably around Maury. For vines to survive on such a sterile matrix, the roots must penetrate deep into the fissures in the rock to find moisture and nutrients during the long dry summers. Wines produced from vines grown on this acidic rock can display a distinctive, high-toned scent and flavour.



Garrigue

Garrigue describes that evergreen scrub which covers untilled land around the vineyards in many areas of Provence and the Languedoc. Usually dominated by the diminutive Kermes oak and arbutus, it is intensely aromatic in the heat of summer with bushes of bay, thyme, rosemary and lavender all contributing to a heady scent of herbs. The transmission of these aromatic oils to the skin of the grapes and hence to the wine is ill-defined, but elusive traces of those herbal flavours appear in some wines.



Winemakers

As the largest contiguous wine producing region in France, the area once had a reputation for mass production, but this has changed in recent times, with young growers and winemakers making their mark. These individuals approach vines and wine with not just the accrued knowledge of a family behind them but with scientific experience gained via viticultural or oenological study. They are more likely to have travelled and experienced winemaking abroad, resulting in a more questioning attitude; one prepared to push the boundaries, to want to do things differently and to respond to the threat of climate change.

Cuisine

The region has an abundance of wonderful produce, naturally complemented by the local wines. Oysters and mussels from the local beds in the Bassin de Thau near Sète are traditionally accompanied by Picpoul de Pinet (see p.7). The cluster of vegetables (and fruit) associated with Provençal cooking - onions, peppers, tomatoes, garlic, aromatic herbs and olives - are a match made in heaven with richer whites and, you guessed it, rosé, for example an intense style such as the Ribotte on p.5. Finally, a glass of red Corbières (see p.10) is the perfect partner for a hearty cassoulet from Castelnaudary.

ROSÉ

The South of France provides the most illustrious rosés in the world. The Languedoc is a source of superb value, whilst Provence produces rosé of the highest quality. We have a new wine from the Languedoc, the Fulcrand Cabanon rosé (p.4), based on Cinsault. The schist soils of Cabrières really shine through in this wine, with a pleasing mineral note being apparent.

We also feature our usual stable of high-quality Provence rosés. The Pinot family of Château Ferry Lacombe have produced another excellent vintage of Mystère (p.5), the ultimate pale crowd-pleaser. The second vintage we have shipped from Château du Seuil (p.5) is every inch as sophisticated as the first. This organic estate based in the Trévaresse hills, between 350-450 meters above sea level has proved a winner since its introduction to the SVS range. Finally, it would be remiss of us not to highlight the Desblaches family's superb Bandol rosé (p.5). Based on Mourvèdre and grown on clay soils, this is a rosé of real power and depth as well as elegance. Be sure to enjoy it "bien frais", just like the Count of Montecristo did in Dumas' great revenge novel of 1844!

We sell far more of the Petit Pont Rosé than we do of the equivalent white and red added together - that's how good this honest rosé is. From Grenache and Cinsault, in the Provençal style, pale, light and refreshing, it offers a scent of red berries and a pretty mouthful of strawberry and cranberry fruit, with a crisp finish. Nothing complicated, just a well-made, dry rosé perfect for regular consumption. Now-2025

L'Estabel, Cabrières Rosé, Fulcrand Cabanon, 2023 12.5%

This is named after the priest who reputedly introduced the wines of Cabrières, in particular a rosé, to the court of Louis XIV, the Sun King. A charming and elegant rosé based on 50% Cinsault, 40% Grenache and 10% Syrah. The Cinsault gives it pure and vibrant red fruit, a summer pudding of a wine, with the Syrah giving just a hint of something spicy in the background. There is also a pleasing mineral note, which elevates this wine. Now-2026

Bandol, a small appellation on the coast east of Marseilles and west of Toulon, produces wonderful and distinctive rosés, based on the Mourvèdre grape which thrives in the sunshine and clay soils. Intense aromas of peach and red fruits dominate on the nose. There is a moreish saline note to this, backed up with grapefruit, white peach and wild strawberry. This has appealing intensity and weight and is a rosé capable of matching even strongly flavoured dishes. Now-2026



BEAUTIFUL SOUTH FOR EVERYDAY – WINES UP TO £13

The following whites and reds show the value to be found in the Beautiful South. For £10–£13 you can get so much variety and flavour. These are a collection of wines that can be enjoyed every day, with food or in front of a screen, and are certain to put a smile on your face.

We recommend the consistently good and beautifully presented wines of Paul and Line Maury from La Combe Saint-Paul. Giles Canton continues to supply his textbook Picpoul (p.7), delivering a bite of bright citrus to the palate. This section is completed by the ever-dependable wines of Domaine Vic and Château La Grave, both delivering fruit forward, honest wines for all palates.

Open, stone fruited attack gives way to a gentler, pine-scented, well-textured mid-palate. Fruity but finishes dry. This is a fine all-rounder, as good an aperitif as with mediterranean fish or vegetable dishes. Now-2025

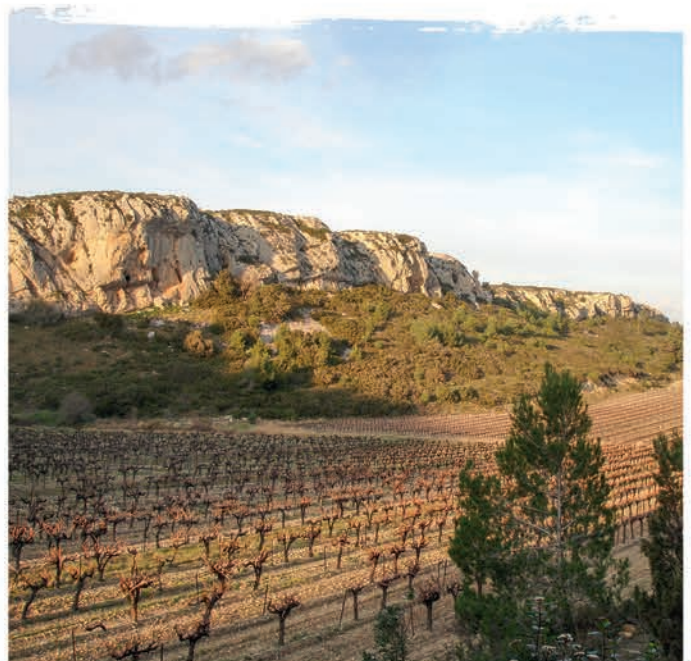
An aromatic and concentrated white from 60% Macabeu, 30% Vermentino and 10% Marsanne. A wine of great interest with some herbal and stone fruit notes and a textured mouthfeel. Enough weight and complexity to handle food but worthy as an aperitif too. Now-2025



L'Estabel, Cabrières

This is our second year of working with the small co-operative L'Estabel in Cabrières. Their wines were a massive hit last year with both customers and critics, making such an impression on Jancis Robinson MW that she made time to visit the winery last summer and purchase wine from them for personal consumption. Under the direction of Luc Flache, director and winemaker, the terroir of Cabrières is being highlighted expertly. What distinguishes Cabrières are the schist soils. Wines from vines grown on schist often display highly aromatic and pure fruit with a distinctive high-toned scent and taste. This can be found in all the L'Estabel wines.

Tasting with L'Estabel was a delight: one can see why the wines were a favourite at the court of Louis XIV! Despite being a small appellation - Cabrières has only 380 hectares under vine - this now features prominently in our Beautiful South list. We have added three wines, a red, white and rosé from the Fulcrand Cabanon range, named after the priest who reputedly introduced the wines of Cabrières to the Sun King's circle.

Smooth, mid weight and bursting with blackberry and blueberry notes. Subtle fruit tannins. A super wine at a modest price which one could profitably lay down. Now-2027

A TASTE OF THE TERROIR – £13 TO £18

This section really is the sweet spot of the Beautiful South. For between £13 - £18 you get wines that show off their provenance beautifully. Whether it is the schist of Cabrières and Faugères, the garrigue of Grés de Montpellier and Terrasses du Larzac or the stony, windy cauldron of Roussillon, this section is full of wines that brilliantly express the terroir that gave birth to them.

Featured are the wines of Domaine Begude and Domaine Pegaline from Limoux and Pic Saint-Loup respectively. Both wineries benefit from being grown at altitude with the wines having wonderful freshness and aromatics. From Corbières there are wines from Domaine Grand Arc, with vines being grown in the shadow of the great Cathar castles of Queribus and Peyrepertuse. From the heartland regions of Grés de Montpellier, La Clape and Terrasses de Larzac there are wines accented by the aromas of garrigue: explore Mas d'Agamas, Mas des Brousses and Clos de l'Amandaie for this. Finally, look for Fontanel's Hominus Sapanius (p.10) to get a sense of the arid heat that shapes the wines of Roussillon.

A blend of 40% Grenache Blanc, 25% Rolle, 25% Roussanne and 10% Macabeu. This is incredibly aromatic and a real delight of a wine. So much interest and so much complexity. Red apple, stone fruit, and acacia. This lasts on the palate for a long time. Pound for pound it is hard to find a better wine. Now-2027

🌿 W Château de la Liquière, Faugères, Amandiers Blanc, 2022 13%

This is from numerous parcels planted on some of the Vidal family's highest land about forty years ago; a blend of Roussanne, Grenache Blanc, Vermentino, Marsanne, Clairette and Bourboulenc. This is so fragrant and aromatic, offering up hothouse scents of citrus blossom and lilies. Stone-fruited with splendid intensity of fruit. It's no surprise that this has become so popular amongst our customers in just a few years. Drink this year.

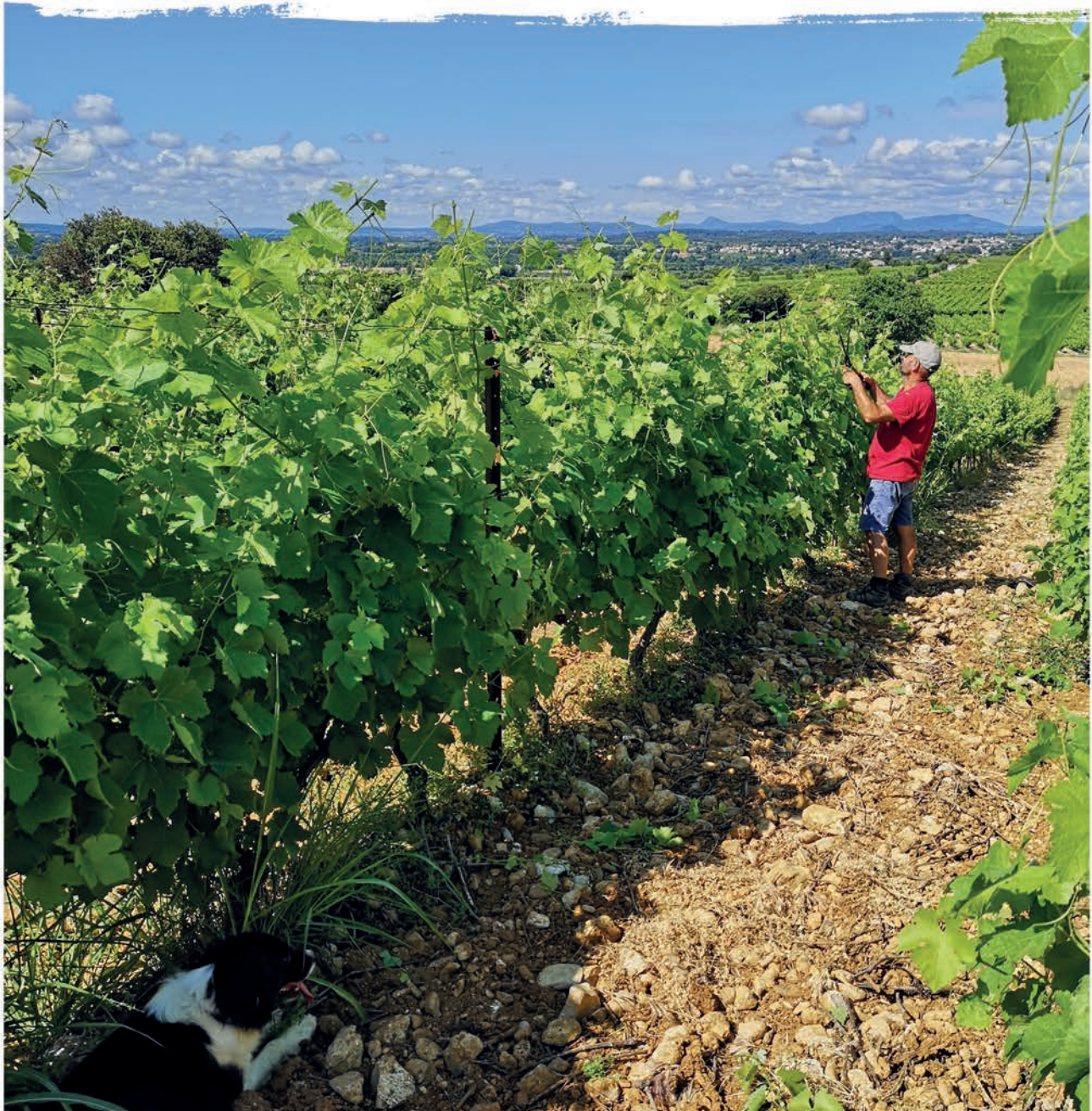

La Liquière is among the finest estates in Faugères. Vidals have lived in the village of Cabrerolles in the very north of the appellation since the seventeenth century, but the estate was really founded by François' grandfather, who was one of the most vocal lobbyists for the creation of the Faugères appellation – which occurred in 1982.

The family have 60 hectares, largely at 300m. of altitude on the schistous slopes which precede the massif to the north. Their wines reflect their situation, showing a natural concentration from very low yields (averaging just 25 hectolitre per hectare) across stony vineyards of largely bush vines; and an elegance which derives from the cooler breezes in the hills.

François expertly showed us through his range. The consistently high quality of their wine is remarkable. There are wines for all palates, with vibrant and juicy wines to be found for everyday drinking along with sublime wines to be enjoyed on special occasions.

These wines represent the best of the Beautiful South. Not only do they express their terroir, but they show off the skill and ingenuity of the winemakers. These are wines fit to mark the most august of celebrations and will match up to their equivalents from so called grander regions. In this section are wines that are excellent now, but all of these will age beautifully and be rewarding for years to come.

Glorious barrel aged whites lead off. They are gastronomic and provide an interesting and great value alternative to white Burgundy. The reds show off the sheer variety available in the south. There are elegant and perfumed reds in the form of Cazaban's Parti Pris (p.14) and La Liquière's La Fabrique (p.14). Fans of the northern Rhône should consider La Combe Saint-Paul, L'Insoupponné (p.14) or the Château de la Liquière, Les Malpas (p.14), both wines based on Syrah. If heavier reds are your thing then check out the two based on Mourvèdre, Pegaline's Du Coeur Au Ventre from Pic Saint-Loup, (p.14) and Ribotte's Bandol Rouge (p.14). Finally, in this section nestles the red we consider to be the acme of the Beautiful South, Mas des Brousses, Terrasses de Larzac (p.14): already superb, we know this ages beautifully. It should be a Grand Cru of the region.

Domaine Fontanel, Tautavel, Côtes du Roussillon



Elodie and Mathieu Collet bought the domaine from Pierre and Marie-Claude Fontaneil in 2017 and have already made a name for themselves, being elected no less than Vignerons de l'Année (Roussillon) du Guide Hachette 2019. They seek to make traditional wines, expressive of Roussillon, but with refinement: the reds are more polished than of old as they achieve finer tannins and a lighter structure.

Winemaking is hard in Roussillon, with Perpignan (the lead city of the region) the hottest and driest city in France. The vines must scratch out an existence on a combination of soils based around granite, gneiss and shist. To add to this, they are exposed to vicious winds. Despite these challenges both Elodie and Mathieu, who are originally from Northern France, are loving life in Roussillon and it shows in their wines. The warmth of the region shines through their wines, powerful but always balanced. There is also a dedication to the traditions of Roussillon, seen in their Vin Doux Naturels and their glorious Maury Sec, Arrels.

ORNAMENTS OF THE BEAUTIFUL SOUTH

In this section we celebrate some of the more distinctive wines of the region. They are the sprinkles and cherries on top of the cake that is the Beautiful South. Firstly, we highlight the bright and elegant sparkling wines from Domaine J. Laurens, based in Limoux. The vines here benefit from cool draughts from the Pyrenees, enabling quality sparkling wine to be produced: fine *méthode champenoise sparklers* without champagne prices.

We finish with the remarkable *Vin Doux Naturels* from Domaine Fontanel. These are created by stopping the fermentation process early by the addition of grape spirit (a process known as mutage) leaving a wine high in natural sugars as well as alcohol, typically 15%-17%. These two very different wines provide the perfect way to finish a meal.

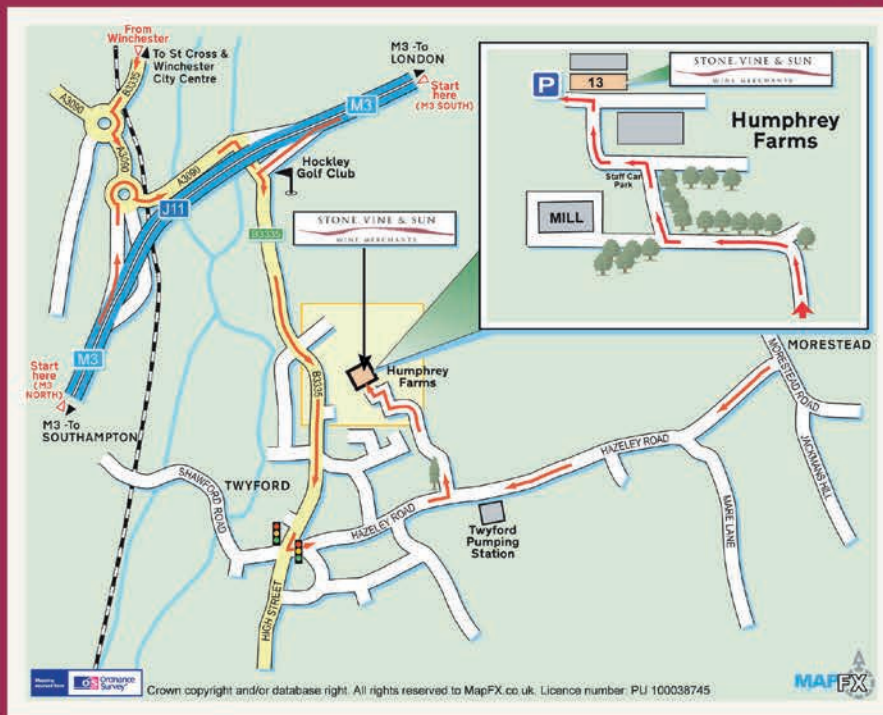
