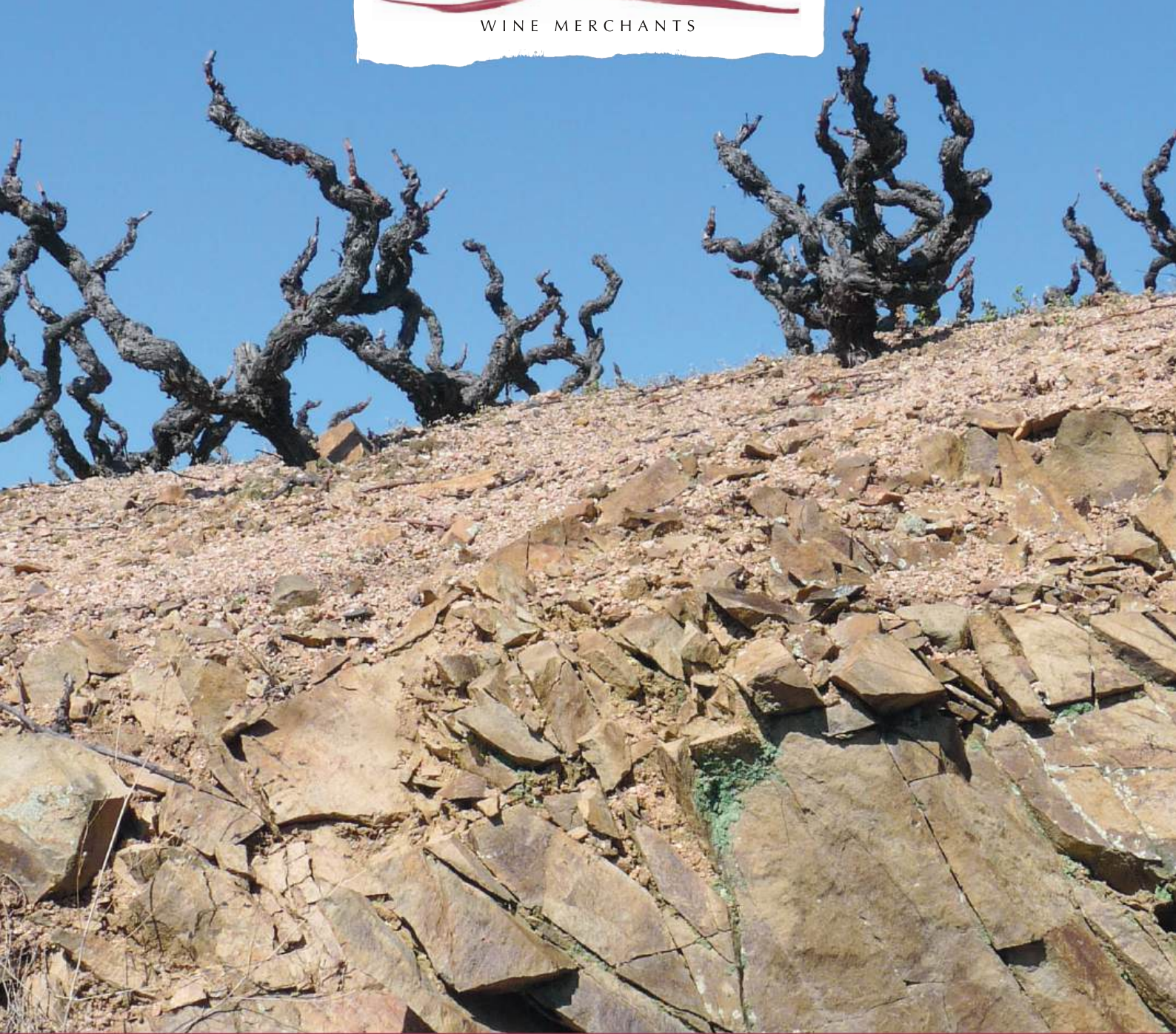

Rightly popular. Now-2026

There's a focus here on the bright and fresh wines of the Loire with additions from the Languedoc, Mâconnais, Alsace and the northern Rhône.

Made by the brilliant, entrepreneurial Jérémie Huchet, master of Muscadet, who saw there was a gap in the market for a light wine made from blending approximate halves of two grapes in plentiful supply in the Loire - the Melon of Muscadet and Sauvignon Blanc. This has an open, grassy Sauvignon-dominated aroma, with a light floral note; and then delivers a zippy, lightly exotically fruited mouthful - a hint of fresh pineapple - with plenty of drive and freshness. Finishes with a zip. Now-2026

Appealing scent of white flowers, stone fruit and a hint of butter. Generous fruit - yellow plum and green melon - with that limestone bite and freshness. Splendid length for a wine at this price. Clearly not a cool climate Chardonnay but so winning. Now-2026

Talmard, Mâcon-Uchizy, 2023, 13%

Benjamin and Mallory Talmard have been making exemplary unoaked Chardonnay for a generation - and we have been shipping from them since the 2001 vintage. It's not surprising this is such a popular unoaked Chardonnay. Lemon-fresh scent with a floral edge. Perfectly refreshing but also nicely rounded. Now-2026

Jean-Luc Meyer, Pinot Blanc, 2023, 12.5%

A long-term favourite at SVS - we have been shipping this organic wine from the Meyer family in Eguisheim since the 2001 vintage. It always over delivers on flavour and texture. Fractionally off-dry in this vintage (just 4 grams residual sugar per litre), with attractive notes of red apple and pear. There is a little weight on the palate and the finish is long and sustaining. A good match for white meat but also always an excellent aperitif. Now-2026

Jérémie Huchet, Muscadet, Les Quinze Hommées, 2022, 12%

One of Jérémie Huchet's "parcelles", organically farmed, single vineyard wines. This is from vines in meagre sandy and stony soils over granite bedrock - known as the granite of Clisson. This is so exciting: creamy aromas are followed by a weighty, pear-accented mouthful cut by a vein of crystalline acidity. Intense and ageworthy. Muscadet like this deserves to be so much more respected and consumed. Now-2028 *"Floral and inviting, this is an example of approachable Muscadet at a great price. Domaine Vendôme, Viognier, Le Puits des Mejeans, IGP Collines Rhodaniennes, 2023, 12.5%

From white clay soils on the slopes above Larnage near Tain L'Hermitage in the northern Rhône: all goes into tank and the malolactic is blocked to preserve freshness. Bright peach and apricot fruit. The stone fruit notes sustain for a long time on the palate with just a note of blossom to round them out. An altogether refreshing and elegant expression of Viognier - it seems churlish to call this poor man's Condrieu, but that's accurate. Excellent as an aperitif or with crab and prawns. Now-2026

Cherrier Père et fils, Sancerre, 2023, 13%

From the Cherrier family's vineyards on the gentle slopes around Verdigny, this is open and expansive. Smelling of citrus zest, it's lemony with hints of tangerine. Well-weighted, this gives way to a dry and chalky finish. Now-2027

This is the Cherrier family's oaked cuvée. About a fifth goes into barrel, some new, giving a dairy richness, intensity and an exotic accent - a hint of guava to the citrus fruit rather than "oakiness". It's a splendid wine, well-rounded, which retains the tension of a top Sancerre. Now-2027

RED BORDEAUX

Climate change has, on the whole, been kind to Bordeaux – notwithstanding terrible vintages in 2013, 2017, 2021 and (probably) 2024. The wines from sunnier years have a ripeness and generosity to them now which is delicious. Wine-making has evolved too, with far more sophisticated tannin management. Together this means one doesn't have to wait for years to drink these wines, even the 2022s. For balance, food-friendliness and concentration, these reds are hard to beat.

Chevalier d'Albran, Bordeaux, 2022, 14%

Chevalier d'Albran is produced by Château Peychaud, located in Ambarès-et-Lagrave, between the Garonne and Dordogne rivers: it's a surprisingly grand Château built in the 17th century by the Marquis de Fayet. From 90% Merlot and 10% Cabernet Sauvignon. Deep hue. Lots of flavour and texture; concentrated for its price with a correct tannic backbone. Traditionally framed claret. Now-2028

Château Florie-Aude, Bordeaux, 2020, 14.5%

From vineyards east of St André de Cubzac and the Côte de Bourg; and named after Florie and Aude, the two daughters of winemaker Daniel Brulatout. This is a ripe and concentrated blend of 85% Merlot and 15% Cabernet Sauvignon. Nicely ready: plenty of black fruit with hints of leather and tobacco – tastes like a more expensive wine. Now-2026

Château Les Gravières de la Brandille, Bordeaux Supérieur, 2020, 14%

We have recently moved on to Frédéric Borderie's 2020, 65% Merlot with 20% Cabernet Sauvignon and 15% Cabernet Franc, unoaked, a superb generic Bordeaux. He chose to adopt his grandfather's marvellous traditional black, red and gold label – on which you can count no less than eight different fonts! An expressive red that should be a staple of all wine racks. A blend of red and dark fruit, with freshness and fine boned tannin. Merlot dominated, this shows real smoothness and charm but also has plenty of body to stand up to food. Now-2027

Château Pey-Martin, Médoc, 2020, 13.5%

The Francisco family – now with father and daughter Stephanie working together – have been making wine at the Château de la Croix (now a Cru Bourgeois) in the northern part of the Médoc since 1870. Pey-Martin is another of their labels, in this vintage 50% Cabernet Sauvignon, 45% Merlot and 5% Cabernet Franc. Classic Left Bank Bordeaux at a reasonable price: good youthful hue; pure, red fruit aromas; mid-weight, almost pretty, with red cherry and berry flavours tickled with vanilla. But there's a correct structure there too. Now-2027

Château Les Combes, Lussac-Saint-Emilion, 2020, 13.5%

Fine tannins give structure and support the fruit. Balanced and refined, this is a smart claret for all occasions. Now-2027

From the far south of the Graves near Langon, a splendidly suave and traditional Bordeaux. The Perromat family's estate is now in its seventh generation, run by Albert with help from his father Jacques and his uncle. They own land at Mazères near Langon at the very southern end of the Graves, with about 50 hectares of gravelly vineyards on limestone sub-soils hacked out of the surrounding forest from 1850. 60% Merlot and 40% Cabernet Sauvignon; and about 20% in barrels. Deeply hued. Already delicious and interesting: red cherry and berry heart tinged with some savoury notes. Lovely ripeness without heat. Graceful, with just the right support of gentle tannins and restrained Graves character. Now-2028

**Château Les Gravières de la Brandille, Âme,
Bordeaux Supérieur, 2016, 13.5%**

Âme – for soul. From about 88% Merlot and 12% Cabernet Sauvignon, and a selection of forty year old vines on prime gravel and clay soils, this has spent 12 months in oak barrels, about 25% new. Cedary aroma; and then a burst of intense red fruit - raspberry coulis. Silky, and so fine, with the merest suggestion of light tannins. Very persistent and aromatic. This wine is always superb, and is often chosen both by our customers ahead of more prestigious names, and by French critics as one of the very best Bordeaux Supérieurs. Decant and tell your friends it's the second wine of a classed growth! Now-2027

**Château Bellerive, Médoc, Cru Bourgeois,

Cru Bourgeois in a top red Bordeaux vintage like 2016 almost always represents a good buy. From 50% Merlot, 40% Cabernet Sauvignon, 8% Cabernet Franc and 2% Petit Verdot, this is already drinking very well. Sombre tone. Inviting aromas of black fruit tinged with liquorice and a certain savouriness; and so consistent in the mouth, with dark plum and berry flavours melded with notes of grilled meat and nicotine. This is mildly old-fashioned, showing correct tannins, with appealing density and attractive maturity. Now-2028

Mickael Moze-Berthon crafts powerful, clean and modern-style reds in the tiny hamlet of Bertin, north of Saint-Emilion. His principal wine is his Montagne Saint-Emilion, from 90% Merlot and 10% Cabernet Franc grown on his seven hectares of vines on thinly-soiled, *argilo-calcaire* slopes, which goes into 30% new oak barrels. Blackcurrant and cherry, with some notes of ripe plum. Attractive vanilla oak notes on lush black fruit. Very smooth and long; this is very satisfying and feels far grander than its price tag. **Château La Rose Trimoulet, Saint-Emilion

75% Merlot, 25% Cabernet Franc, from the Brisson family who have been making wine since the 1800s. Only 6,000 bottles from 5ha., all into barrel, 30% new. The oak is present on the aromatics, but it's well integrated on the palate. Deep red core. Blackcurrant flavours tinged with dark chocolate. Smooth and rounded with satisfying fruit concentration, and just beginning to show a certain savouriness. Hearty SEGC at a fair price. Now-2027

The top red from the Perromat estate (see above) – and the best vintage we have ever shipped (we started with 2006) of this terrific claret from about 60% Merlot, 30% Cabernet Sauvignon and 10% Petit Verdot, well-oaked. Refined, cigar-box perfume. Open, blackfruited attack; so aromatically expressive, with a richly textured depth of black (and a little red) fruit flavours enlivened by secondary hints of smoke, dark liquorice and Christmas spice. This punches far, far above its price. Now-2028

Château de la Grenière, Lussac Saint-Emilion, Cuvée de la Chartreuse, 2019, 14%

Ambition realized: a really classy blend of 40% Merlot with 30% of each of Cabernets Sauvignon and Franc (an unusually high proportion of Cabernet Sauvignon on the right bank); aged in 40% new oak, 40% first refill and 20% third use. From an estate with 17th century roots, and owned by the Dubreuil family since 1914, now with the fourth and fifth generation in charge, father Jean Pierre and son Audren. The 15 hectare estate is in the north-east of the appellation, bringing two benefits: the vineyards lie predominantly on gravelly soils, with some sand and clay; and it's also two degrees centigrade cooler than St.-Emilion, a boon in this age of climate change. Splendid deep ruby. Scent of black fruit and spice. That same vivid curranty fruit, not sweet but just a little charmingly dried, runs through the wine. Excellent texture. Drinking well now but years to go as well. Great drive and persistence. Now-2029

Mickael Moze-Berthon (see above) has only 1¼ hectares of land within the Saint-Emilion Grand Cru boundary, just across the road from the famed Pomerol property of Le Bon Pasteur, but as his cellar is outside the limits of the St Emilion Grand Cru appellation he can only sell it as Saint-Emilion – so he is delivering wine from a Grand Cru terroir at a more modest price. Rich and velvety. Deeply hued and opaque. Black fruit: blackberries and black cherries, accented with dark chocolate. Intense and harmonious, with pleasing flesh. Very long. Now-2030

"Cool tree-bark and liquorice-chocolate scents. Slim, old-brushed-velvet smoking-jacket tannins. Slim, green-sinewed but ripe and juice-tight blackcurrant fruit. Classic, elegant, agile. Minty fresh finish. Roast-lamb wine! An extraordinarily classy, good-value St-Émilion. Cabannes is a tiny seven hectare estate bought by Canadian Peter Kjeilberg in 1997. He replanted five hectares – so those now mature vines complement others planted in 1965, all farmed organically (in conversion for the 2022 vintage). 100% Merlot, this goes into 30% new oak (restrained by SEGC standards); and that shows in its approachability. Very deep and lustrous ruby colour. Gorgeous red fruit, vivid and fleshy, with a clean oak veneer. Youthful exuberance well covers a proper tannic structure. So exciting already, we are confident this will also age beautifully. Now-2034

ITALIAN REDS

The proportion of Italian wine in our sales figures grows year on year; reflecting a greater knowledge and appreciation of these wines among our customers. As important, there has unquestionably been less cost inflation coming out of Italy than in France – so there's an argument to be made that these wines are arguably now offering better value against those of their neighbour than hitherto. Here's just a selection of our range, tilted towards weightier wines more suitable for cold weather drinking.

The South

The south is home to a bewildering number of ancient grape varieties – of these certainly Primitivo is the best known: though Negroamaro and many others are worthy rivals.

Rocca, Negroamaro, Salento, 2022, 13.5%

Well-made example of this masculine southern grape, aged part in stainless steel and part in old oak. Hearty, with some structure, but also ready to drink. Generous black fruit, warming, mildly spicy and wild. Now-2026

Michele Biancardi, Primitivo Puro, IGT Puglia, 2022, 13.5%

As the name implies, 100% Primitivo. Such a seductive wine – flamboyant colour; a fragrant fruit cocktail of fresh strawberries, red cherries, blackcurrants and blueberries; plus notes of liquorice, spice and pepper. Juicy enough to drink on its own yet with plenty of concentration for food. Gorgeous vitality and punch. Now-2026

"It's highly unusual to find a Puglia Primitivo at 13.5% (they're usually 15%) so I am not surprised that this wine tastes like it might be off dry. Arrested fermentation, possibly? It doesn't matter. The wine is fresh and juicy. The fruit is honest, full of Puglian warmth and generosity, cooked damsons and strawberries and cranberries. The tannins are as soft as cashmere and you'll want to wrap yourself in them if you're cold and it's dark and rainy outside, or if you have flu. If you like a bone-dry red, you'll recoil. But if you're adventurous and love food as much as wine, you'll nab this as the perfect wine for cold, smoked duck breast served with cranberry sauce; or warm red-cabbage salad topped with caramelised hazelnuts and ricotta cheese and dressed with a cranberry dressing. Tuscany and the Marche

Sangiovese is the dominant red grape in a band across Italy from the shores of Tuscany in the west to the Adriatic in the east.

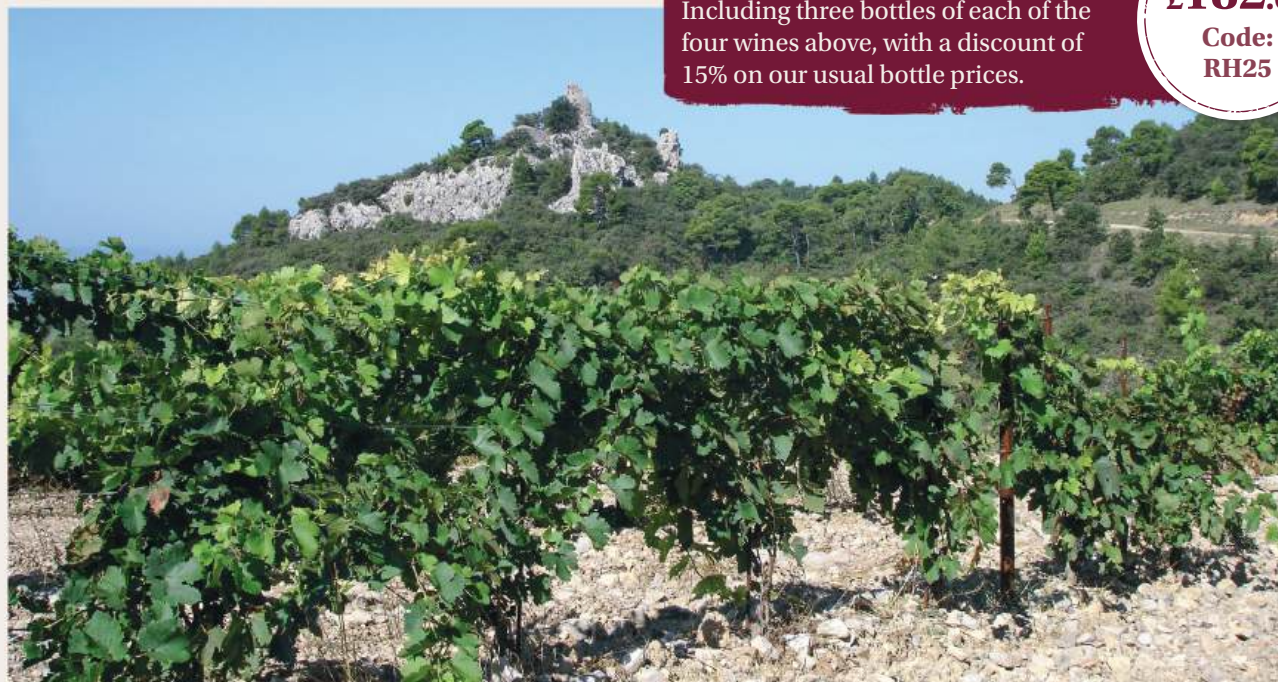
