



Drinking Bordeaux under £20

Bordeaux's 2024 En Primeur was over before it began this year, the victim of a poor vintage, unrealistic pricing from the Châteaux owners and a saturated secondary market. Buying this way just doesn't make sense - why pay up front when you can pick up the same wine ready to drink for the same price (or less)?

This selection shows the sense in a very different strategy, that of seeking out wines from smaller Châteaux in very good years. Whisper it, but they may just be some of the best value wines in our range.



Courbin Héritage, Graves, 2023

Bottle: £15.50 6% off 6: £87.42 12% off 12: £163.68

Brothers Franck and Stéphane Courbin farm this 16 ha estate, equally divided between white and red, in Budos, a village about 45km south of Bordeaux within the Graves appellation. This is their best white, a blend of 85% Semillon with 15% Sauvignon Blanc, with a proportion of the blend aged in oak for four months to add some weight and complexity. It is a very serious wine for the price with stone fruit, cream and orange zest notes. Brill with brill as my fishmonger likes to say. 13.5%. Now-2026

Comte de Gironde, Bordeaux Rouge, 2020

Every list needs a go-to traditionally-styled claret at a good price and this is our current offering. Tasted blind, it couldn't be anything other than a red Bordeaux. Medium-bodied, with cassis fruit and fine tannins, it ticks a lot of boxes. A very good midweek or lunchtime wine. 13.5%. Now-2026

Château La Plaige, Bordeaux Superieur, 2023

Made by Frédéric and Lise Naud from vineyards near the Dordogne river. This is the 16th vintage we have shipped - we started with 2005. It's a charmingly blue, red and gold labelled blend of 60% Merlot and 40% Cabernet Sauvignon that is ripe and fruit forward with a touch of oak adding depth and structure. A wine that is very popular with our restaurant customers who need a reliable Bordeaux that punches well above its price tag. 14%. Now-2028

Gravieres de la Brandille, Bordeaux Superieur, 2020

2020 Bordeaux at this price should not be overlooked, 65% Merlot with 20% Cabernet Sauvignon and 15% Cabernet Franc, it is an unoaked expressive red that should be a staple of all wine racks. A blend of red and dark fruit. with freshness and fine boned tannin. Merlot dominated, this shows real smoothness and charm but also has plenty of body to stand up to food, 14%, Now-2027

Château Les Combes, Lussac-Saint-Emilion,

100% unoaked Merlot from a single vineyard with thin soils over limestone located at one of the highest points in the appellation. A long term SVS favourites from grower Frédéric Borderie, it has fresh blackberry and plum fruit and there is a stony note on the finish. Fine tanning give structure and support the fruit. Balanced and refined, this is a smart claret for all occasions. 13.5%. Now-2027

Château Bellerive, Médoc, Cru Bourgeois, 2016

Code: BEL116

Cru Bourgeois in a top red Bordeaux vintage like 2016 almost always represents a good buy - especially at nine years old. A blend of 50% Merlot, 40% Cabernet Sauvignon, 8% Cabernet Franc and 2% Petit Verdot, this is drinking very well. Inviting aromas of black fruit tinged with liquorice and a certain savouriness; and so consistent in the mouth, with dark plum and berry flavours melded with notes of grilled meat and tobacco. Slightly old fashioned - and we absolutely mean that as a compliment - it is very correct with appealing density and attractive maturity. 14%. Now-2028



Brilliant Burgundy

Autumn and Burgundy are a fine combination. The best whites have a weight and gravity that one needs after a summer of ice buckets and rosé; a back-to-school reminder that serious food requires a wine with

Meanwhile the reds, with their sous bois notes of damp earth and forest fruit, are never better than when sipped alongside game and wild mushrooms. Gastronomy at its finest.

Talmard, Mâcon-Uchizy, 2024

Bottle: £15.95 6% off 6: £89.96 12% off 12: £168.43

This is one of our best-selling wines for a reason - it is consistent year after year and always offers a proper glass of white Burgundy at a very fair price. It's unoaked but sensitive use of bâtonnage and malolactic fermentation mean it has a hint of butter alongside the lemon and apple fruit with very good concentration given the modest 12% alcohol, A winner, Now-2027

Clotilde Davenne, Bourgogne Aligoté, 2023

Code: CLO623

Bottle: £17.95 6% off 6: £101.24 12% off 12: £189.55

Aligoté is the 'other' white grape in Burgundy. In the wrong hands it is best used in a Kir, but top growers like Davenne produce outstanding wines from it, especially in warmer vintages such as this. It is crisp, energetic and vibrant with saline and crushed oyster shell notes alongside zippy lemon fruit. Oysters would be a classic match but it makes a fine partner for smoked salmon too. 12.5%. Now-2027



Domaine Réné Lequin-Colin, Bourgogne Chardonnav, 2023

The sister wine of François Lequin's ever popular Back to the Roots cuvée. Sourced from the same vineyards, located adjacent to others classified as Santenay village, this sees just 50% oak compared to Back to The Roots' 100%. The result is a more fruit-driven wine that emphasises citrus, white peach and Bramley apple notes with just a splash of iersev cream. If Back to the Roots is roast chicken wine then this is one to match with seafood - seared scallops or skate with black butter would both be superb. 12.5%, Now-2028

Domaine des Crêts, Mâcon Chardonnay, En Bout, 2022

Just arrived! We tasted this with François Leguin (of Domaine Lequin-Colin above) in Paris in February. It's the top wine from his side hustle in the Mâconnais and we were blown away. Handpicked Chardonnay from vines planted on limestone at 300m above sea level overlooking Tournus. Barrel-fermented with 15% new oak. Intense, balanced and long with green apple and crème fraiche notes (the real thing from Normandy rather than the insipid supermarket stuff). This would be super with a traditional baked ham, 12.5%, Now-2028



Domaine Fichet. Bourgogne Tradition. Pinot Noir, 2023

We listed this for the first time in the summer and have broken our golden rule of never promoting the same wine in successive offers. Why? Simply because we think this superbly priced, very well made, red Burgundy needs to find as many new fans as possible. It has everything we look for in entry-level red Burgundy: perfumed red fruit, freshness and a savoury edge that distinguishes it from New World Pinot Noir, A superb Sunday wine – try it with a pot roast pheasant. 12.5%. Françoise & Denis Clair, Hautes Côtes de Beaune Rouge, 2021

We are finding the Hautes Côtes an increasingly happy hunting ground for good value Burgundy. The vines are sited further up the slopes of the Côte d'Or than the village or cru vinevards. and are thus cooler. The wines can't match the concentration and depth of their more celebrated counterparts but do have a wonderful freshness and vivacity. This is a great example; vibrant ruby in the glass, with crushed raspberry and violet fruit. A delightfully traditional expression of cool climate Pinot, 12.5%, Now-2028

Agnes Paguet, Auxey-Duresses Rouge, 2020

Bottle: £37.95 6% off 6: £214.04 12% off 12: £400.75

From two parcels, one of 50 years of age and one planted in 2000. Matured in oak for 12 months, 15% new. A lovely Pinot from a hot and sunny vintage, just coming into its own. There's an attractive synthesis of ripe red and black cherries, some savoury development and subtle tannins. 13%, Now-2029

Château du Bourgneuf, Mercurey Rouge, 1er Cru La Bondue, 2022

Code: BGN622

Bottle: £39.50 6% off 6: £222.78 12% off 12: £417.12

The 1er Cru sites in Mercurey are arrayed on the hills surrounding the village. La Bondue it situated halfway up the hill and is planted on a plot of red calcareous soil. This gives the wine real intensity and drive. This is the most robust of Bourgneuf's 1er Crus and as a result it spends three more months in oak (used 500l. barrels) than the other 1er crus. A wonderful blend of red and dark fruit, the acidity brings it all together. There is structure and power here but it is elegant and aromatic. A wine that delivers satisfaction on many levels. 13%. Now-2030
















Mad for Madiran: Château Barrejat

Denis Capmartin is everything we look for in a French vigneron. He speaks quietly in a robust Gascon accent, eschews the crude commercial world of the major international trade fairs and concentrates on what he knows best: caring for his vines and making wines that speak deeply of the soils and terroir. Denis is the 4th generation of his family at the helm and, for all the tradition on show, is a thoughtful winemaker who continues to refine his vineyard and cellar practices with each vintage. The 2022 reds are as good as we can remember Denis making, and given we have shipped every vintage since 2005 that is no mean feat.



Pacherenc du Vic-Bilh Sec, 2024

Bottle: £14.50 6% off 6: £81.78 12% off 12: £153.12

Over to Michael for this one: "I cook slow roasted chicken, stuffed with lemon and garlic, smothered in butter and pimentón, on a bed of potatoes, for my family on a Sunday at least once a month and this is the wine that goes with it. Chock full of green fruit and blossom it has the character and interest to match the meal - a south-west brasserie wine with a classic brasserie dish". A little known - and hard to pronounce - but delicious Gros Manseng from the same area as Madiran. Always an exuberant and full-flavoured wine, it shows a pineapple accent, with satisfying texture and concentration. 13.5%. Now-2027

Madiran, Tradition, 2022

Bottle: £12.95 6% off 6: £73.04 12% off 12: £136.75

Madiran has a reputation in some quarters for being old school, dark, tannic and leathery. This blend of local grape Tannat (about 60%) with Cabernets Sauvignon and Franc (20% each) is anything but that: it's beautifully ripe and silky - the best country wine you could imagine. In this sunny vintage it evinces black-fruited aromas followed by a gorgeous mouthful of red and black fruit backed by a weave of supple tannins. Honest, dry and savoury, terrific with any meat dish, very more-ish and deservedly a best seller. Also available in magnums and 5 litre jeroboams for celebrations. 13%. Now-2028

"Lively blackish crimson, Firm, rich, some but not excessive tannin. Very sappy and refreshing. Arguably more interesting than a red bordeaux at this excellent price. Juicy but structured. Should last well. In fact if you ever needed a snip of a 5-litre bottle for a celebration in 2028, go for this! Long. Madiran, Vieux Ceps, 2022

Nothing to do with wild mushrooms, the Ceps in the name are a local word for vines, and some of the vines here are very old indeed. Most are over 80 years of age and some are pre-phylloxera so could be pushing 150, 80% Tannat plus the Cabernets. well-oaked. That oak shows with overt toast on the nose. Flamboyant flavours of cherry, plum and blueberry, all tinged with mocha. Dense, full-bodied; and with plenty of tannin to keep it going - enjoy now or keep for years. Also available in magnums. 14.5%. Now-2030

"Really quite rich and ripe on the nose - quite a surprise for a Tannat-based wine! Sweet start with the Tannat tannins well hidden. This should really appeal to those who like a wine to drink now and cellar. It's not a bordeaux copy but has its own very distinctive local personality. Oakphobes should avoid but even at this early stage there is enough distraction from the oak which should fade GV.16.5+/20. Drink 2024-2030" Jancis Robinson MW, jancisrobinson.com, 25th October 2024.

Domaine Verzier, Chavanay

Philippe Verzier was just 19 years old in 1988 when his father died and he inherited the family's mixed fruit farm near Condrieu, at the time a largely forgotten and unloved appellation. Phillipe believed firmly that the estate's future was in wine and he has slowly built up the estate's vine holdings from 2.5ha to 10ha, with plots in Condrieu, Saint-Joseph and the IGP Collines Rhodaniennes.

Now joined by his son Maxime, the estate is thriving and Matt Walls in Decanter recently wrote that "Maxime is making exactly the kind of wines that more and more of us want to drink" praising his low-intervention approach that makes a "suite of St-Josephs that feel transparent. Like a motor with a Perspex lid, you feel like you can see the inner workings within each wine."

St-Joseph Blanc, Granit, 2023

Bottle: £32.95 6% off 6: £185.84 12% off 12: £347.95

Equal parts Marsanne and Roussanne, 90% aged in barrel and 10% in clay amphorae. Simply stunning and complete in every way; one of the most exciting whites we have introduced in years, 12.5%. Now-2028

"Really delicious oaked, certified-biodynamic northern-Rhône blend of Marsanne and Roussanne. Pungent with notes of mirabelle and peach. Condrieu, Authentic, 2022

Condrieu deserves its reputation as one of France's greatest white wine appellations. Viognier solo in excelsis. The vines here are from a terraced plot named Chante-Perdrix (the singing partridge), "très granitique" as Maxime Verzier says, between 200m. and 330m, on the Izeras hillside, Pale gold, Scent of honeysuckle. Pure heart of apricots and cream. Subtle oak framing. Honeyed and appealingly viscous. Finish just lifted by a saline hint. A wonderful wine to pair with any rich seafood dish, in particular lobster and crab, 13%, Now-2027

🖣 St-Joseph, Empreinte, 2021 🮏

Code: VER221

Bottle: £29.95 6% off 6: £168.92 12% off 12: £316.27

At four years old this is just beginning to reach its peak, 100% Syrah made in a very pure, unforced style with bountiful fresh fruit - red berries, redcurrant and blueberries - all seasoned with a pinch of ground pink peppercorns. Very perfumed and elegant. A bottle (or two) of this and pan-fried duck breast with pommes anna would make a very fine dinner indeed, 12%, Now-2027

Domaine des Amadieu, Cairanne

Corrine and Yves Houser bought Domaine des Amadieu in 2007 and quickly set about the task of producing the wines they wanted to drink. They have farmed their 7ha. biodynamically since 2012 and focused on quality rather than expansion. The wines are among the very best in Cairanne, and there are few better across the whole of the Southern Rhône. They have an uncommon lift and vitality; true to their terroir with ripe, sun-baked fruit but energetic and joyful too. We have shipped a small amount of the oaked white Cairanne this year having been very impressed when we tasted it back in February - anyone who enjoys white Châteauneuf should take a close look before we sell out.

Cairanne Blanc, Haut de Beauregard, 2022

Code: AMB622

Roussanne, Clairette, Grenache Blanc and Viognier. barrel fermented and aged in a mix of old oak and clay amphorae. Has the presence of a top white Châteauneuf-du-Pape: opulent and powerful. Ripe stone fruit, with baked apples and a hint of dried orange peel balanced by subtly spiced oak. Structured and serious, this is a wine for fine seafood dishes, 14%, Now-2029

Côtes du Rhône Villages, 2023

Bottle: £16.75 6% off 6: £94.47 12% off 12: £176.88

This wine came up the other day in the office as we tasted through some samples of Spanish Garnacha (Grenache). Some were very good but, as we repeatedly said "not a patch on Amadieu's Côtes du Rhône Villages!" 60% Grenache, 20% Syrah and Cinsault, all in tank, it bursts with strawberries and spice on the nose. Very pure and bright with sappy red cherry and cranberry on the palate, whilst maintaining a savoury edge. Brilliant for the price. 14%. Now-2028

Cairanne, Vieilles Vignes, 2022 🦃

Code: AMB322

Bottle: £21.50 6% off 6: £121.26 12% off 12: £227.04

From 60 year old vines of 40% Grenache with Syrah, Mourvedre & Carignan. Organic and biodynamically farmed, about 15% goes into barrels. The 2020 vintage was stunning and this is a more than worthy successor. Beautiful, inviting nose that draws you in. Deep and spicy on the palate with mouth-watering red berry fruit enhanced with a few twists of the black pepper mill. Very vibrant and energetic with very fine tannins and an impressively long finish. Chapeau. 14%. Now-2030



Vignerons d'Estézargues, Estézargues

This producer needs no introduction to long time SVS customers. A small, quality-focused co-operative near Avignon, Simon first visited them over twenty years ago and loved seeing the locals filling up their jerry cans with Côtes du Rhône from what looked like a petrol pump. We have been importing the wine ever since and continue to delight in the sheer drinkability of the Cuvée des Galets.

Côtes du Rhône, Galets, 2022

Bottle: £12.95 6% off 6: £73.04 12% off 12: £136.75

A paint-by-numbers Côtes du Rhône that works every time. Dry but juicy raspberry fruit with notes of Christmas spices and a smooth, warming finish. It's very good with top-quality sausage and mash but can equally be enjoyed on the sofa with whatever series you are watching on Netflix. 14%. Now-2027

Domaine des Espiers, Vacqueyras

Phillipe Cartoux is one of our most genial growers. Tall and broad with a rugby player's handshake he farms seven plots of vines across the Sablet, Cairanne, Côtes du Rhône and Gigondas appellations. All the wines are organic – and have been since the mid-1990s. Now joined in the cellar by his daughter Amélie, Phillipe continues to push boundaries in the cellar, in an attempt to make his wines as true to their terroir as possible. The phrase 'Natural Wine' can be emotive and unhelpful at times, but is not out of place here. Philippe's wines are made with minimal intervention but, crucially, he rejects dogma and ensures they are stable and age worthy. The fact he supplies some of the finest Michelin-starred restaurants in France and beyond is testament to the quality here.

Espiers, Côtes du Rhône, 2023 💝

Code: ESP123

Bottle: £17.25 6% off 6: £97.29 12% off 12: £182.16

60% Grenache with 20% of each of Mourvèdre and Syrah, all in concrete only. "Vin Biologique et Nature" it says on the back label, emphasising Philippe Cartoux's commitment to reducing sulphur in his wines. A classic, hearty, black-fruited and savoury red from densely planted, low yielding vines around Vacqueyras and Gigondas. Power but not without elegance. 14%. Now-2029

Sablet, 9mg, Côtes du Rhône Villages, 2023

Code: ESP423

Bottle: £21.50 6% off 6: £121.26 12% off 12: £227.04

The 9mg on the refers to the extremely low dose of sulphites in the wine. This is sourced from Philippe's vineyards on the better land on the slopes above the village towards Seguret. Largely Grenache but with about 25-30% Syrah, all raised in stainless steel tanks. Sensational perfume - cassis and roses. Delectable, pure and velvety flavours - heated strawberries with freshness and energy. Is this Philippe's best value wine? It's certainly better than many a Châteauneuf-du-Pape, 14%, Now-2029



Gigondas, Les Grames, 2023 🞏

Les Grames is a single vineyard wine made from 75% Grenache and 25% Syrah, given eight months in large 600l. demi-muids, not to lend oak flavour but just to round it out. So ripe. Penetrating red fruit nose. Gorgeous heart, redolent of strawberry liqueur. Intense but not in the least heavy: this delivers power with grace. Already approachable but with years to go. One for a daube or any hearty slow cooked dish. 15%. Now-2031

Domaine des Garriguettes, Châteauneuf-de-Gadagne

Young Sébastien Clement now runs this family domaine in 'the other' Châteauneuf, Châteauneuf-de-Gadagne, having gained experience in the northern Rhône, Portugal and Australia. He immediately converted to organic and bio-dynamic (certified) viticulture and has built a reputation for producing vibrant, balanced wines, often with much lower alcohol levels than one normally finds in the Southern Rhône. His pair of Côtes du Rhônes - the Fleur de Lune white and Cinsault-dominated Béret Bleu red - are two of our best loved and best-selling wines and these new vintages are simply superb.



Côtes du Rhône Blanc, Fleur de Lune, 2024

Supple and ripe with classic strawberry Grenache notes alongside wild thyme and warm stones. Will reward cellaring. 14.5%. 2026 - 2036

SPANISH SPOTLIGHT: El Lagar de Isilla, Ribera del Duero

The Zapatero Pinot family were restaurateurs before they were winemakers, owning the highly regarded Lagar de Isilla restaurant in Aranda de Duero. In 1995, they decided to branch out into winemaking and made their first vintage in the cellars under the dining room. So successful were the wines that they quickly outgrew the cellars and the family built a winery and barrel cellar nearby.

Today they farm 40ha of vines, predominantly Tempranillo, on poor clay-sand soils at an altitude of between 828 and 840m above sea level. This altitude ensures the hot summer days are balanced by cool nights, preserving the fruit and freshness in the grapes.

The reds are ripe and full-bodied with judicious use of oak and fine, supple tannins. We have shipped a tiny quantity (just 36 bottles) of their top white wine this year made from the Albillo grape; a daft decision from a commercial perspective but sometimes we taste something and just have to ship a few bottles.

Ribero del Duero, Albillo Mayor Selección de Añada, 2022

After 16 months in French oak this is a delightful mix of spiced herbs and stone fruit. French barrels to create a wine of supreme power and elegance. Glossy blackcurrant and loganberry are sprinkled with baking spices. There is something slightly gamey to this wine with pleasing sayoury notes on the finish. Grill yourself a large slab of Galician Beef and enjoy this superb wine in style. 15%. Now-2030

Ribera Del Duero. Matanza de Soria. 2020

This wine is a brilliant example of the innovation being conducted in Ribera del Duero at the moment. There is a growing focus on terroir and the results are fantastic. There is a thrilling nose of aromatic red fruit, rose petals and ripe plums. The palate is intense, long with more dark fruit and spice appearing. A wine for enjoying now but will age brilliantly, 14%, Now-2032

Deep in the Douro: Whites & Reds from Portugal's top region

The Douro Valley, upriver from Porto, is one of Europe's most beautiful wine regions blessed with steep terraces often planted with a mix of old and unusual grape varieties. It is, of course, famous for being the home of Port but its unfortified table wines are now highly sought after too. Geographic, who make the Lento and Inospito wines, is the brainchild of partners (in life and in wine) Nuno Morais Vaz and Daniela Matias.

To quote Portuguese wine expert Ines Salpico writing in Decanter: "(Daniela's) clearheadedness and low-intervention approach are a clear complement to (Nuno's) winemaking abilities, passion for terroir and bonhomie. Together, they've built an intriguing portfolio of expressive wines, of great purity and typicity."

Quinta do Convento is located on the steep, granite slopes of Távora Valley, a tributary of the Douro. The vines are planted on north and north-east facing slopes and altitudes of between 320 and 430m. The resulting cool climate produces wines with an elegance and lightness of touch that is a world away from the darker, sweeter, more alcoholic wines produced on warmer sites.



Lento, Vinho Branco, Douro, 2023

The oak comes through on the palate (the wine is aged in new 300 litre barrels) but it adds a silky veneer rather than any vanilla or chocolate notes. New Vintage Releases from Hoddles Creek & Wickhams Road, Australia

"If you love Australian chardonnay and/or pinot noir, then Hoddles Creek in the Yarra Valley is your ground zero. Every year, for the past twenty years, it has been the only must-buy producer of chardonnay and pinot noir on the Australian market....both the quality and the value consistently on offer... is so striking. A Ten Star Winery", Campbell Mattinson, Australia's Best Wineries, 2025.

Here is what is becoming our annual offer of the latest vintages from Franco D'Anna. These wines are amongst the jewels of our portfolio.

Winemaker Franco D'Anna's wines are hugely applauded both in Australia - see the reviews quoted below - and whenever we send samples to journalists here. All vines are hand pruned and harvested; and all grapes are crushed at the family's winery, constructed for the 2003 vintage.

The family owns ten hectares of Pinot Noir (five clones) and six of Chardonnay, plus Pinot Gris and other reds. Winemaking is determinedly non-interventionist: some whole bunches are put in the tank; almost always fermented with wild veasts, without additions of enzymes or acid; and bottled without fining or filtration. These are cool climate wines: note the lowish alcohol levels.

All but the Wickhams Road Pinot Noir (13.7%) are between 12.5% and 13.2%, reflecting the influence of both the chilly southern ocean and the altitude on the family's vineyards in the highest district of the Upper Yarra.

Our shipment will dock later this month, so all these wines will be available for delivery shortly. This is a terrific offer, valid only until the end of October, with big discounts on their retail bottle prices - which in turn are flat on current vintages. emphasising the value here. We know you can't compare apples and oranges, but these look even more underpriced now: the Chardonnays are real Burgundy challengers; and the Pinots look great value against the smarter estates in Central Otago, New Zealand.

Wickhams Road, Chardonnay, Yea Valley, 2024

Hoddles Creek, Pinot Gris, Yarra Valley, 2024

A fascinating wine, with great flavour, energy and tension, and a bit of tannin - as it's in part vinified more like a red than a white. The salmon pink hue (not orange) comes from the natural rosy pigmentation in the skins of the Pinot Gris grape. Almost all of the blend is handpicked into tanks and foot stomped to release the juice so it can be in contact with the skins. No sulphur is added and the wine is chilled down to 12 degrees to wait for fermentation to begin. Near the completion of fermentation, it's pressed and the juice goes into old oak barrel to finish. A small proportion of the blend is destemmed - but not crushed - and left to soak for 24 hours at 12 degrees; fermentation kicks off naturally. This is then pressed after about seven days on skins: this more tannic component is effectively treated as a red wine, 12.5%, Now-2027 "70% fermented on skins for three days with the balance on skins for 14 days. A bright and enticing pale salmon. Aromatic with its bouquet of poached white pear, red apple and jasmine. Gently textured with just the right amount of grip to balance. A beautifully made and interesting pinot gris to pair

with everything from cheese to grilled fish and



The Mendoza clone gives a very forward flavour, with plenty of ripeness and richness even when picked early. This is a different animal to the Estate or Syberia Chardonnays. Some creaminess on the nose, but lovely acidity on the palate. Fullflavoured. Franco thinks this should age gracefully for 7-10 years. 12.5%. Now-2031

"With a bright light-yellow appearance, this charming wine has a fragrant bouquet with slaty/ mineral, honey and green melon aromas, plus a creamy lees overlay. More generous than usual in this warmer vintage. Finesse and freshness. 12.8%. Now-2030
