Bordeaux and SW France

The Bordeaux region doesn't get a fair crack of the whip these days: the wines can be viewed as too expensive and too old school. It's absurd. Below the top 100 grand Châteaux the prices are stable and more than fair; and there are as many young vignerons determined to improve quality as anywhere else in France. Most important, the region is one of the winners in the climate change stakes: with warmer summers excellent wine can be made in decent volumes outside the perfect - but all too small - hallowed terroirs. It's already clear that 2015 and 2016 make up another of those harmonious pairings of excellent vintages in Bordeaux. As with 2009 and 2010, one can generalise: 2015 produced big, open wines for early drinking whilst 2010 is a "classic" vintage, with a more elegant structure. The summer of 2015 was hotter, so the grapes had higher sugar levels (and therefore higher alcohol) and less acidity. 2015 reds are softer, the fruit flavours are riper and they are so approachable and already delicious. 2016 was cooler, with fewer days in August over 35°C, so the resultant wines have fresher fruit, better acidity, and arguably, more complexity.

Château Perron, Lalande de Pomerol, 2015, 13%

About 80% Merlot and 10% each of Cabernet Franc and Sauvignon, from vines averaging 65 years old, and aged in barrel; 20% new, 40% first fill and 40% second fill. Charming perfume of fresh red berries. Silky and refined, not that concentrated but all in harmony. Cool red and black fruit. Showing less oak than many 2015s, this already gives a lot of pleasure. Now-2024

Château Barréjat, Madiran, Cuvée de l'Extrême, 2016, 14.5%

Extreme indeed: the inky, super-dense juice of ancient Tannat vines given 18 months in new barrels. Overt oaky waft. Voluptuous, bittersweet cherries (from candied to sour Morello) and sweet notes from the oak remind one of Black Forest gâteau. Hugely concentrated but not heavy. Extravagantly youthful - might last a long time.



Frederic Borderie at Gravières de la Brandille, Les Combes & Vieille Dynastie

We have been working with Fred since he emerged as a young star thirteen years ago. He now owns and runs three distinct vineyard areas with different labels: Gravières de la Brandille, from vineyards on gravel and clay terraces by the river Isle near St Medard de Guizières; Les Combes on the higher, limestone-based vineyards of Lussac-Saint-Emilion; and Vieille Dynastie, a parcel of six hectares of warm, clayey Lalande de Pomerol bought with this name in 2011.

Fred chooses unusual methods by Bordeaux standards; only one of the wines we list, the Gravières Prestige, goes into barrel. All the other wines are unoaked. When drinking them one is not aware of this: Fred explains that with long maceration (i.e. soaking of the juice with the skins and pips) "some tannins from the ripe seeds give light toasted flavours". Here are his 2015s for immediate consumption - and his stunning 2016s are listed opposite. We can not recommend these brilliant wines more highly.



Los Seduras, Sauvignon Blanc, Valle Central, 2018, 12.5% [Screwcap]

The latest vintage of this SB, to be applauded for its typicity to the grape variety at a fair price. Bright, crisp and fruity; a lightly tropical perfume and then a juicy mouthful of grassy and pineapple flavours, with a refreshing finish. Now-early 2020

Karu, Chardonnay, Valle Central, 2017, 13% [Screwcap]

Crafted by the winemaking team at Emiliana, this is a well-made, very lightly oaked, ripe, pineapple-accented Chardonnay. Now-early 2020

Carmenère, a Bordeaux grape related to Cabernet Franc, is much more successful in the heat of Chile than it in its home in south-west France. (Where once it was a significant component in Bordeaux it is now an alsoran there). This is a juicy wine, a pleasant cocktail of redcurrant, blackberry and raspberry, with the merest hint of the tobacco / nicotine notes which mark the grape. The Gran Verano wines are made at Vina Apaltagua from their own estate grown grapes. Now-2020

Does Merlot on a label seem to be going out of fashion, now a victim of its past success? It does seem rather odd given the huge volumes of right bank Bordeaux we sell, most of which is 75%+ Merlot! This is such a drinkable bottle, a big step up on a simple house Chilean Merlot. It shows juicy red cherry, a hint of cinnamon and a correct herbaceous note. Fleshy, not in the least jammy, and sufficiently restrained to be food friendly. Now-2020





We are the sole importers of this brilliantly charged and zippy SB. It's crisp and precise, showing cool lemon and gooseberry Sauvignon flavours with a mineral bite. Drink this year

Invariably an open, juicy and friendly Kiwi SB. Elderflower and grapey perfume. Bright and citrussy - an easydrinking aperitif. Drink this year

We never rush to sell this upon first shipping: it's a steely, intense SB which needs several months in bottle before it shows at its best. We have been buying Pouilly-Fumé from the Blanchet family for 17 vintages. From vineyards, some on sand and some on flint soils, around the little village of Pouilly on the Loire east of Sancerre, this is always very true to the appellation, displaying bright lemon over a mineral acid thread. Fresh and bone dry on the finish, it accompanies a wide range of fish well, from smoked salmon via flat fish to cod and haddock. Now-2020

Southern French Reds

Les Pradelles, IGP d'Hérault, 2017, 12% [Screwcap]

From Carignan and Grenache, carefully crafted at the

futuristic co-operative winery at Cébazan. Red fruited with a surprisingly good texture, no rough edges, soft, light and juicily berried. Perfect for parties - or just sitting in front of the box. Now-early 2020

Château La Grave, Minervois, Tristan et Julien, 2016, 13%

From the Orosquette family, and named after two once tiny and now strapping cousins, a bright and uncomplicated, easy drinking red from halves of Syrah and Grenache. Youthful purple. 

From young vines of Grenache, Mourvèdre and Carignan grown in hot, dry and windy mountain vineyards near Tautavel (so it could actually be labelled as Côte du Roussillon Villages). Gorgeously juicy and vital wine, lacking any bite of tannin, showing vibrant strawberry fruit, spiced with white pepper and liquorice. Australians would call it "smashable" for its enticing, drink-me perkiness - but it's an authentic Roussillon wine through and through. Now-2020

German Riesling

Once as highly valued as the finest Bordeaux, German Riesling has slowly gone out of fashion in the last forty years. The principal reason is that "sweetness" in wine is now looked down upon as a vice, and anyone who enjoys it is wrongly viewed as unsophisticated. To those who lean that way please note: first, there's a lot more dry ("Trocken") German Riesling now than there used to be and these styles work with a wide range of rich food such as ham and pork or salmon and oysters, as the acidity cuts fattiness so adroitly. Secondly, what sweetness there is in better German wine is balanced by citrussy acidity - so that a wine which initially appears vividly fruity up front actually finishes on a refreshing note. And whilst Kabinetts and Spätleses are usually drunk as appetitesharpening aperitifs, they can also accompany seafood well, especially prawns, scallops and crab with a bit of sweetness and/or spice, as in Thai curries.

Helmut Dönnhoff, Ernie Loosen and Johannes Leitz are among Germany's top winemakers - do try these lovely, long-lived whites with a 10% discount; and a mixed dozen with 12.5% off.

Walt, Riesling, Pfalz, 2017, 11% [Screwcap]

The Pfalz region near Alsace is perhaps better known for dry Riesling, but this is in the traditional style, which delivers an appealing balance between refreshing acidity and some residual sugar (about 20 grams a litre here). Grapefruity zip. Now-2021

Guntrum, Louis Dry Riesling, Rheinhessen, 2016, 12.5%

With just under 7 grams of residual sugar, this well-priced dry Riesling is nicely balanced, offering citrus and stone fruit. Now-2021

Dr Loosen, Estate Riesling, Mosel, 2016, 8% [Screwcap]

Ernie Loosen's entry level, off-dry Riesling is a benchmark Mosel example, showing the classic balance of sweetness and acid. Ripe lemon and green apple, fruity and refreshing. Now-2022

Leitz, Eins-Zwei-Dry, Riesling Trocken, Rheingau, 2016, 12% [Screwcap]

This dry Riesling from Johannes Leitz's south-facing vineyards above the Rhine won the 2018 International Wine Challenge German White Trophy, beating numerous far more expensive wines: "Super clean and tight. Lemon zest aromas, youthful but with lots of potential. Floral, honeysuckle and lime flower aromas and flavours. Creamy mid-palate, fresh, lively, zesty finish". Now-2022

Dönnhoff, Riesling Qba, 2013, 9.5% [Screwcap]

From the Dönnhoff family's vineyards of the middle Nahe region, on weathered volcanic soils with slate and quartzite. Elderflower and pineapple, very pure fruit character, and just off dry. Now-2021

Dr Loosen, Erdener Treppchen, Riesling Kabinett, Mosel, 2016, 8% [Screwcap]

From the brutally steep, red slate vineyard. Delicious flavours - elderflower and lemon sherbet, with just a suggestion of spritz. A bottle can vanish awfully quickly. Now-2021

Leitz, Rudesheimer Magdalenenkreuz, Riesling Spätlese, 2017, 8% [Screwcap]

Bottle £17.95 £16.15 Code LEI217

From this well-sited vineyard high above the Rhine (with a red sandstone cross, *Kreuz*, reputedly dedicated to Mary Magdalene after the Black Death), a classic Spätlese with great depth of flavour: a scent of lemon sherbet; and then a really open mouthful of white peach and grape juice, lovely mid-palate sweetness (about 78gms/l.) and a mineral, clean and lasting finish. You could enjoy this with rich seafood like crab. Now-2023

Dönnhoff, Tonschiefer, Riesling Trocken, 2016, 12% [Screwcap]

Tonschiefer = clay slate. From low yields on dark clay / slate soils in the Leistenberg and Hanglagen vineyards, this is a stunning dry Riesling: perfumed and penetrating, with heft. Now-2022

Samo Premrn at Pasji Rep - a new star from Slovenia

I have now tasted twice with young Samo Premrn and each time found myself in awe of his command of winemaking, the purity and perfect linearity of his wines, the smartness of his labels and his general aura of genius. We have been out prospecting for over twenty years now; but it's not often we come across someone like this: we had to be his first UK importer.

His vineyards lie on largely north facing slopes at the eastern end of the Vipava Valley (Vipavska Dolina), which is open to the Adriatic at the western end and cooled by downdrafts from the Julian Alps to the north. All wines are certified organic and made using near natural techniques - but without any of the faults one so often sees in natural wine! In particular the two whites have some skin contact, a time-honoured and now much revived tradition in Slovenia - i.e. the juice is left on the skins of the grapes (as is customary in red wine making) for days, gaining flavours, texture and even a whisper of tannin.

White

Pasji Rep, Zelen, Vipavska Dolina, 2017, 11.5%

Bottle £13.50 £12.15 Code PAS117

Zelen used to be highly rated, the grape for the aristocracy in the Vipava Valley, but as it's fragile and low-yielding it's now just grown in a few pockets there. This is given some skin contact, lots of lees stirring, malolactic fermentation, and a third goes into old, neutral barrels. Mid-weight, peach-fruited, creamy, with notes of sourdough and herbs. In some ways Zelen has Viognier and Muscat-like flavours, but it has a graceful personality all of its own and a depth of flavour which belies the lowish alcohol. Two days after seeing Samo I ate at Hisa Franko in Kobarid, arguably Slovenia's top restaurant. When I asked the sommelier for a glass of white wine before dinner I was brought a glass of this - that says it all. Now-2020

Pasji Rep, Jebatschin White, Vipavska Dolina, 2016, 13%

A lightly oaked blend based on 50% Malvasia from ancient vines, with 30% Rebula (the Italian Ribolla Gialla), 10% of Zelen and 10% others, picked late and given six days skin contact. Intense stone fruit, accented by orange blossom, fennel and cereals; rounded and energetic. Brilliant, highly aromatic white in a Mediterranean idiom. Now-2021

Red

Pasji Rep, Jebatschin Red, Vipavska Dolina, 2016, 14%

Merlot dominated, with about 15% Cabernet Franc and a little Barbera, well-oaked in a mix of new and old barrels, a beautifully ripe and flamboyant wine, delivering polished berried fruit with vanilla. Perfectly fresh, suave and clean, it lies in style between a very smart right bank Bordeaux - like a Lalande de Pomerol for example - and a gorgeous super-Tuscan. Now-2022

Pasji Rep, Pinot Noir, Vipavska Dolina, 2016, 14%

Bottle £20.95 £18.85 Code PAS816

The Vipava Valley is a sweet spot for Pinot. Bright raspberries, very ripe and fleshy, concentrated, with a proper spine too. Very high quality Pinot. Now-2022


Michele Taliano, Montà, Piedmont

Michele Taliano Sernì, Roero Arneis, 2017, 13.5%

Brothers Alberto and Ezio Taliano are third generation growers with a cellar in Montà d'Alba. Their 13 hectares of vineyards are largely in Roero, which is just to the north of the river Tanaro.

If you go prospecting in Piedmont you drink a lot of Arneis - and it deserves to be better known as it has a lot more personality than most Italian white grapes. It's an ancient white grape in the region, a speciality of the Roero, where its name translates as "extrovert". Appealing scents: lemon verbena, pine woods and grassiness; and then a ripe, rounded palate, redolent of lime, cream and herbs. Excellent as an aperitif or with herby chicken or fish. Now-2020





Talosa, Montepulciano, Tuscany

Talosa, Rosso di Montepulciano, 2016, 13.5%

We have been working with the family owned Talosa estate for seven years now: they may not be the grandest address in Montepulciano (although their cellars are spectacular, hollowed out of the rock), but their wines consistently win awards in Italy and deliver extremely fair value. From the excellent 2016 vintage, which was distinguished by lovely sunny weather but also marked diurnal differences of temperature, this is from about 85% Sangiovese, with 15% Merlot, Canaiolo and Mammolo, aged in old barrels.

This is a big and youthful red, offering classic Sangiovese sour cherry and berry flavours; and there are good tannins there too, covered by the lush fruit. Attractively fat on the palate, it offers excellent concentration for a Rosso di Montepulciano and has the stuffing to keep well. So food friendly with everything from robust meat pasta dishes to roast pork or veal or strongly flavoured poultry. A lot of wine for about £12.50! Now-2022
